Alleluia! Christ is risen!

As always, there's a lot of information in this month's newsletter. Spirit of Joy is an active community and your mission and ministry team leaders and staff are doing excellent work. Please read through it, join in when you are able, pray always. Here's an introduction and invitation to Holy Week as Spirit of Joy.

Holy Week Devotions— each day of Holy Week we'll publish a special devotion for the week. These are meant as an invitation to set this week aside as special and be intentional, taking about 5-10 minutes to acknowledge Christ's journey through the cross and tomb to victory.

Palm Sunday Worship will begin with the procession of the palms. Our One Sunday band will lead us in song as we join the voices of the hopeful throughout the ages shouting "Hosanna! Hosanna to the Son of David!". This morning's worship will end with a reading of the Passion, moving us from joy to sorrow and inviting us into the deep stillness of the week.

Maundy Thursday Worship is at 6:30pm. During this special evening we will welcome eleven first time communion recipients to join us at the table. We'll remember Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples, how he knelt and washed their feet, and finally, how he was abandoned and stripped bare with the stripping of the worship space.

Good Friday Worship is in stations. Please sign up at <u>spiritofjoy.net/signups</u>. Worship tours begin at 6pm with the last one starting at 7pm. The worship experience lasts about 30 minutes as we hear, feel, and experience the Passion throughout our facility.

Easter morning worship is at 7, 8:45, and 11.

You Are Invited

Our Coordinator of High School Faith Formation, Madeline Trosvig, would like to invite Spirit of Joy partners to her senior sermon at Augustana University on April 21 at 10:00 a.m. in the Chapel of Reconciliation on Augie's campus.

Psalm 104:24-25 O Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom have you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. Yonder is the sea, great and wide, creeping things innumerable are there, living things both small and great.

Earth Day is April 22nd. *Thank you, Lord, for the beauty of your Creation*. We have been reading **I Am** statements from Jesus throughout Lent, one of which was "I am the good shepherd." As Benjamin Stewart wrote in the April 22, 2021, issue of Living Lutheran, we are given an "image of God as a shepherd leading us to green pastures, beside still waters. The enduring power of this imagery speaks to our deepest hopes on Earth Day—that our bodies will be protected from harm and find a home on the good earth, near clean waters."

Now, of course, Earth Day is not a religious holiday, but it does fall within the Easter Season. As Stewart further writes, "Today, the mainstream environmental movement is beginning to come to terms with the Good Friday truth to which those at the margins of power have long testified: that the environmental sins of the world are heaped disproportionately on the bodies of the poor, immigrants and people of color. Easter is an exposure of this perversion of justice and a celebration of the sacred power that rises up and overthrows it, out of love for vulnerable bodies and the good earth."

According to climate scientist and Christian, Katharine Hayhoe, there is mounting scientific evidence clearly documenting the risks presented by climate change to the poor, the needy, and other vulnerable populations who indeed are the very neighbors we are called to love and serve. She asserts that if we believe that God created this planet that we live on and this universe that it's placed in, then "what is science other than studying God's creation?"

What can we do this Earth Day to care for God's creation and love and serve our neighbors?

- Praise God for His boundless gifts throughout Creation.
- Pray for neighbors in need, especially those impacted by flooding, famine, drought, war, overcultivation, deforestation, desertification, etc.
- Policy changes can happen when we all get involved. Pray for leaders in positions of power but also make sure they hear from us. Try joining a group like Earthjustice, the Sierra Club, or Natural Resources Defense Council or even a local group like SoDak350. Write or call local and state representatives. Write or call companies and urge them to change practices that harm the environment if they want to keep our business.
- Peace and prosperity can be aided by donations to groups like ELCA Good Gifts.
- Plant seeds of love and trees and other greens.
