Did you know that August 10th is National S'mores Day and August 30th is National Toasted Marshmallow Day? Hang onto summer while you can and enjoy one of those days! What could be more fun than gathering around the fire roasting marshmallows while enjoying fellowship with family and friends in the great outdoors?

Did you know that fire has been a symbol of God's presence for ages (i.e., the burning bush, the pillar of fire in the desert, the tabernacle lamps)?

As fun as campfires and firepits are, however, there have been far too many wildfires over the past several years. In fact, many of the most destructive and large-scale ones occurred within the last 7 years. Although they are unplanned events that happen naturally (i.e., lightning strikes) or from human-related activity (i.e., a discarded cigarette, campfires, or downed power lines), research has shown that climate changes have led to hotter and drier conditions, which have "fueled" the fires. Furthermore, the average season for wildfires is 3 months longer than it was just decades ago.

Not all fires are bad; they are a natural phenomenon with ecological purposes of clearing diseased and dead plants and trees from the forests. In this instance, they are a "healthy burn" requiring no intervention to regenerate.

When they burn out of control and wreak havoc on thousands of acres, they result in loss of wildlife habitat, loss of human life (there have been deaths of hundreds of firefighters), and poor air quality producing respiratory ailments. Also, when forests burn, they release carbon emissions and greenhouse gases whereas an intact, older forest typically acts as a carbon sink.

We want to be able to enjoy our national forests, our campfires, and all the other gifts that God placed in the forests. When you go camping and have a campfire, make sure you follow the rules. Another way you can help is to do an Internet search of legitimate reforestation projects and make a contribution if you feel so moved. You could also donate to the Wildland Firefighter Foundation.

You could also read the book, *Reforesting Faith* by Matthew Sleeth, MD, Executive Director of Blessed Earth. He says, "Other than people, trees are mentioned more than any other creation in the Bible. There is a tree on the first page of Genesis and on the last page of Revelation...Trees remind us that life is much bigger than our present moment. Their deep roots and sprawling branches call us to look to heaven and eternity."

Have you ever wondered what goes into the Communion Bread we use at Spirit of Joy? Try making it on your own!



Communion Bread

1 1/2 cups white flour 1/2 cup wheat flour 3/4 tsp. baking soda 1 T. Sugar 2 T. oil 3/4 cup water

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Blend all dry ingredients. Add oil and water. Mix well. Divide into 4 equal parts. Press each into a circle 1/2" thick. Bake 10-12 min.
