From the Bishop's Desk

Dear SD Synod,

Grace and peace to you!

Is your tank full or empty these days? Many among us had thought that the Covid vaccine and summer would bring relief to our chronic state of exhaustion. But as I listen to folks across the state and across the church, I frequently hear that that is not the case. Exhaustion is still lingering in our bones. Going back to normal doesn't seem to come as readily as we had hoped. You have heard me say it many times, but I'll say it again, while we may return to normal by what meets the eye, no mask-wearing, and social events, etc, COVID has altered who we are as individuals and as communities. We all ran a mental, emotional, and physical marathon, and we need to understand that we need to recover.

I am a runner, and I know that after each long run I have to allow my body to rest. Rest is essential for my tired bones and overworked muscles to rejuvenate so that I am able to run again. Resting doesn't mean vegging out on the couch doing nothing, in fact, that kind of behavior would be counterproductive to restoring my energy and running capacity. Resting means to slow down and gently begin moving forward through mindful stretches and movement.

As we plan for fall activities with the hope that we will return to normal and go at full speed, please be mindful that your "church muscles" just emerged from running a marathon and will need gentle but disciplined movement in order to recover. Please, always remember that this is God's Church, that it is not through our own works that we are saved and beloved, but solemnly by and through the grace and mercy of God. Be patient with yourself and your neighbor and begin everything you do with some deep breaths and prayer.

New Spaces at Spirit of Joy

As we have returned to more robust use of the building and look forward to the start of fall programming, we thought it appropriate to provide an update on the end of construction projects and the ongoing process of "living into" our new space!

Water lines have been reconnected to the spigots that serve the trees along Western Ave.

Journey Group and its sub-contractors have been out to address issues with drainage, carpet tile adhesion, and light fixtures. Work remains underway.

Chairs arrived for the worship space on Friday, July 23rd. Thank you to all who helped unpackage and move them in place!

Sound System fine tuning continues. One of the wireless mics is being repaired. A proposal will be made to the Leadership Team in August to purchase additional monitors and wireless mics to reduce visual clutter on the chancel. An enormous thank you to Mark and Roxanne Berdahl for the donation of the new outdoor sound system!


Clean up and organization saw great progress on Tuesday, July 20th. Thank you to all who came and made that night such a tremendous success. Amy, Donna, Chad, Heather, Susan, and others continue making decisions about organization, disposal, and getting items into their new home. They'd sure appreciate your help!

Mother's Room is being painted and decorated. Work should be completed soon. Thank you to Amy Orr, Tracy Dahl-Webb and Bill Webb!

Sound Abatement in the Fellowship Hall is out for bids. We've asked both JLG Architects (in cooperation with Interstate Office Products) and Foss AVI to provide proposals. This is a high priority as we hope more of you will continue to join us throughout the fall.

During the remodel, a decision was made to make upgrades to the **indoor air quality** of the building with the addition of needlepoint bi-polar ionization (NBPI) systems on each air handling unit. These systems are installed into the ductwork of the HVAC systems. The device produces negatively and positively charged ions that attach to particles in the air enlarging them and making them easier to be captured by the filters in the air system or so heavy that they fall out of the air flow. The ions also can attach to many viruses and bacteria to deactivate them. These systems are known for eliminating unwanted odors also. NBPI systems are being installed in hospitals, schools and restaurants throughout the country anticipating that the Covid-19 virus will be another virus that can be deactivated with this treatment. This system has a 10-15-year life with no need for maintenance during that time.

We provide:

- * A faith-filled learning environment, incorporating Bible stories and activities into the entire day: prayer, songs, Chapel, and play time. For example, retelling the story of Jonah and the whale with by making a large fish with a table, costumes, and flannelboard sets.
- * Outdoor Learning- We take the learning themes outside as often as possible, blessed to have a beautiful playground, gardens, and large green spaces to explore.
- Social Skills- learning more about ourselves and how to work together in a caring community that is teacher led. How do I feel? What can I do when this happens? Encouraging one another and practice working together.
- Safe, clean environment with health protocols in place including daily toy cleaning, clean air ventilation systems installed in the building, and policies guided by the CDC and SD Department of Health.
- Kindermusik- learning through varied styles of music and instruments that reinforces literacy and math skills.

Reaching Out & On the Move! Fundraiser Update

On Sunday, August 1 your preschool began its fundraising initiative to purchase a preschool van. Quality preschool education benefits are life-long, offering not only academic skills but also practice in playing cooperatively, making choices, independence



and resilience for our children. However, we have phone calls each year asking for transportation due to family work schedules or geographical limitations. Children are missing the opportunity to attend preschool due to transportation. Our goal is to raise funds for a van that would provide transportation to & from preschool. This van will be used daily, providing a safe vehicle and car seats, driven by safe adults, with personalized care for each family's needs.

The fundraiser collected \$1,192- a great start toward the big goal! But your help is needed and appreciated and there are many ways to join this project:

- 1. Purchase a beautiful, blue t-shirt "Go Out With Joy" and proceeds from the t-shirt will go directly to the preschool. Children and adult sizes are available and orders can be placed anytime. Contact Amy Cauble for more information.
- 2. Offering- Allocate a donation to the preschool van fund using the tithely app or place an envelope in the offering plate with a note marked "VAN FUND". 100% of funds raised at this time will be placed toward the purchase of a van. Average cost of used van = \$25,000 plus insurance and maintenance.
- 3. If you or someone you know is purchasing a different car and would like to donate their current van or SUV, please contact the preschool office. We would be happy to visit with you more about this option.
- 4. Prayer- Prayers of discernment and guidance for the preschool and its team are appreciated.
