Katherine and I were driving across town one mid-November afternoon. I was checking out the music playing on a variety of FM stations when I came across David Bowie and Bing Crosby singing, "Come, they told me, pa rum

pa pa pum...."

"It's starting already!" I complained.

"Here we go again," my wife replied. "Let the pre-Thanksgiving Christmas music protest begin."

"It's too early! They could at least wait until we've digested the turkey and pumpkin pie."

"You make this same speech every year," Katherine sighed. "Obviously there are lots of people ready to hear and sing Christmas carols *before* receiving *your* permission!"

Well, okay then. This is most certainly true. It's not that I don't like singing Christmas songs in months other than December. (I can verify we have sung *Joy to the World* in our church in July!) One reason for my protest is that I fear we will skip right on by so many beautiful songs for Advent that speak so profoundly to life as we know it right now.

Advent songs are filled with verses about God coming to us as we watch and wait for God to show up and transform this weary and wounded world. Before we get to the manger on Christmas Eve, we hear a pregnant Mary sing of God coming to turn the world right side up:

> [The Lord] has brought down the powerful f rom their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. (Lk 1:52-53)

We hear old Zechariah sing after the birth of his son John:

By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.... (Lk 1:78-79)

We hear the haunting lament of a song that gives voice to those *Lost in the Night:* 

Lost in the night do the people yet languish, longing for morning the darkness to vanquish, plaintively sighing with hearts full of anguish, Will not day come soon? ELW 243

We sing of joyous expectation of the coming of that day which is not here yet but on the way, the day in which God will make all things new:

> Rejoice, rejoice, take heart in the night, though dark the winter and cheerless, The rising sun shall crown you with light, be strong and loving and fearless. Love be our song and love our prayer and love our endless story; May God fill every day we share and bring us at last into glory. ELW 242

The words and tunes may not be as familiar as the many beloved carols we will also sing together this month. I hope you will still be blessed by the longing and hope in these Advent songs as we prepare for another Christmas, and even more importantly, for the fulfillment of the Promise. PJE


# Outreach Opportunities






### Preschool Van Fund Continues!
