Matthew 1:18-23 Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. ²⁰But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²²All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

²³"Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

Pick up a weekly devotional, join us at 6:15 on Wednesday nights for Holden Evening Prayer, use the daily Advent calendar with your family, stop in Shalom Center to color and pray, come to our Children's Christmas Program at 11:00 on the 11th, invite a friend to join you at one of our three services on Christmas Eve, or pull up close with your family on Christmas morning and join us as we bring you the good news that God is with us via YouTube and Facebook.

Becoming Settled in United States

What is the difference between an immigrant and a refugee? Immigrants choose to leave their homes and may come with temporary visas, allowing them to remain for a period of time or under certain conditions such as students or tourists. They may have permission that allows them to remain indefinitely. Refugees flee their homes because they are afraid for their personal safety. They are unable to return home because of fear of persecution. Refugees arrive with temporary residency and may apply for legal permanent status residency after one year. After five years, legal permanent residents may apply for citizenship. All refugees are eligible for employment.

Why does the United States resettle refugees? It is part of a global humanitarian mission begun after World War II when more than 250,000 Europeans were resettled. It may take up to ten years or more for the refugee process when coming to the United States. It starts by running to other countries due to a fear for their safety. The next step is to apply to the United Nations High Commission (UNHCR) for protection. If approved, they are assigned to a refugee camp. They may be sent back to their country of origin or accepted for resettlement. Some are allowed to meet with U. S. government officials to compile personal information and conduct security checks. If accepted, this can take between 18 months and two years. They wait for an

interview with U.S. Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services. They are also fingerprinted, go through a series of medical checkups, and are photographed. After all these steps individuals are then connected with agencies such as Lutheran Social Services. LSS resettled 50 refugees in South Dakota in 2020. This is less than .5% of the total refugees settled in the United States.

How does LSS help? LSS helps with initial housing and basic needs assistance. Through federal funding, refugees are eligible for up to eight months of cash assistance until selfsufficiency is reached. To receive this, employable adults must cooperate with an employment program and attend at least six hours a week of English language training and 30 hours of community orientation. Core services provided by LSS include community orientation and education, case management, employment services, English Language training, immigration services, and interpreter services. LSS case management and employment services are available for up to five years. All refugees are legally qualified for employment upon arrival. Employment services assist in finding first jobs as well as job upgrades. English language training is available four days and two nights a week. Classes focus on oral and written English skills. LSS immigration attorneys assist refugees who are pursuing permanent residency or U.S. citizenship.

Hope, **peace**, **love**, and **joy** to our Spirit of Joy partners from the Creation Care Team as we meet in the season of Advent and celebrate and rejoice in the birth of Christ – love come down to earth. As we sing songs about **peace on earth**, let us reflect on ways we can help this beautiful planet we have been gifted. Maybe we can turn our attention to ways we can show God's love by helping the earth and all God's creatures.

Did you know about ELCA Good Gifts (https://goodgifts.elca.org/all-gifts)? Here, you can purchase gifts anywhere from \$10 to over \$500 that do good for others such as purchasing a fruit tree seedling that will not only thrive in dry conditions and prevent soil erosion but also provide food to adults and children. Or you can buy a shared plot of land and soil, add drought -resistant seeds, and top it off with the gift of honeybees. Check it out and/or join up with others to make a lasting impact.

Did you know that food loss and food waste in the US alone typically equals the annual carbon dioxide emissions of 42 coal-fired power plants? (this doesn't even include emissions from food waste rotting in landfills) Have you ever composted? Did you know there is a countertop composter from Lomi that can turn your food waste into plant-friendly dirt? There is a pilot program happening now with SoDak Compost and IronFox Farm that will hopefully have more drop-off sites for compost soon in Sioux Falls. Composting is actually a fun habit to pick up for 2023 and beyond.

Did you know that you can recycle wrapping paper as long as it rips BUT you cannot recycle wrapping paper that has foil, glitter, or is super shiny? You can also recycle Christmas cards as long as they are paper with no foil or glitter. You can recycle gift bags as long as they are paper and not shiny or foil or glittery. Photo paper, Christmas photo cards, bows, and ribbons are NOT recyclable and should go in the garbage. Did you know that if your Christmas lights don't work anymore, you CANNOT recycle them BUT you should not throw them away either? Instead, take them to the Sioux Falls Household Hazardous Waste Facility off of N Cliff. Better yet, round up nonworking lights from people you know so you only use 1 vehicle and make 1 trip to the facility!










Scooters and Study-Intergenerational Bible Study Kick-Off is January 11 at Scooters Coffee (85th & Minnesota)
