

2024 Stewardship Dreaming

2023 has been a tremendous year in Mission and Ministry as Spirit of Joy. We welcomed three new staff members and Deacon Hannah transitioned roles. We went to camp, worshiped on summer evenings, launched new small groups, and gathered for Town Hall Meetings to tell the story. We strengthened and expanded our Milestone Ministry, brought



back the Confirmation Banquet, and focused deeply on developing relationships. With all the activity and a growing participation and membership, it seems appropriate to look back at our goals, assess how we have done, and begin to look forward to 2024. If you'd like to read more about how we did towards our 2023 goals, look back to the November newsletter in your email or on our website. This month, a look forward to 2024.

Our first goal for 2024 is again to fully fund our mission plan.

In order to accomplish that goal we are projecting that we will need to grow our income by 7.5%. While our total proposal for our budget is actually a reduction from what was proposed for 2023, your Leadership Team believes that it better reflects our reality. We project to end 2023 with our largest ever annual income. We welcomed more than 80 new partners, and we saw upticks in participation in mission and ministry across all of Spirit of Joy. That ministry can't continue without you!

To establish an Endowment Fund.

This work began in 2023. We approved bylaws Then, at and policies in February. our Congregation Meeting we elected our Endowment Committee. Now, we need to give them work to do. The funds that we hope to establish are: 1. The General Fund, 2. The Capital Fund, 3. The Mission Outreach Fund, 4. The Faith Formation Fund. We believe that this is one strategy for securing our future. If you would like to name a fund, a one-time gift of \$25,000 allows you to do that. Speak to Joel Christensen if you are interested in leading the way into our future in this way!

To reduce our mortgage debt by \$300,000.

We accomplished this goal in 2023 without trying. As our Overflowing campaign completes its second year in April, we look forward to continuing to move towards a reduced debt burden and more freedom for mission and ministry in years to come. We're very excited to have new building use policies in place that allow us to practice Radical Hospitality with still more partners and neighbors. In the fall of 2023, our regular weekly building use exceeds 800 people per week. Everything from worship and preschool to investment clubs, Tai Chi, and community bands are blessed to have a beautiful safe facility for their work. Do know, Pr. Eric is beginning to whisper that he might challenge us to be debt free by our 25th Anniversary on All Saints Sunday 2027!

You can help us to achieve these goals by prayerfully considering how you and your family can practice extravagant generosity with the pledge cards mailed to your home and available throughout Spirit of Joy's gathering space. Commitment Worship was Wednesday Nov. 15th and Sunday Nov. 19th, but if you missed those dates and would still like to bless us with your support going into 2024 just drop the card in the mail, or bring it by the office.




Outreach Opportunities

Creation Care Corner

"Hope blooms in a weary world When creatures, once forlorn, find wilderness reborn. Hope blooms in a weary world; The promised green of Eden comes." – ELW 726

In this **Advent** season when we light a candle for hope, we can look for signs of hopefulness from others working to protect God's creation. Though much collective action remains to be endeavored, there are a myriad of discoveries, inventions, and clever ways our global community is working to care for God's creation and combat the climate crisis. Let's take a look at some:

- Across the country, many decommissioned coal plants are being turned into clean energy powerhouses that generate solar and wind energy and serve as a battery storage system
- Rooftop greenhouses (See the original rooftop farm at Lufa Farms, Montreal lufa.com) are types of farms people are placing on rooftops of abandoned buildings or in a downtown setting, bringing ag to the cities, growing food without pesticides, capturing rainwater, composting waste, and selling food to their communities.
- Fishing nets that break down from UV light over time vs sitting perpetually in the ocean entangling ocean life are in the works so eventually we may see an ocean free of ghost nets
- In Japan, they are using food waste to propel trains (search for "the Japanese tourist train that's fueled by ramen")
- What is PETase? It's a fairly recently discovered enzyme, PET hydrolase, that has been found to break down PET (polyethylene terephthalate). It is a plasticeating fungal enzyme that will work under certain conditions on certain kinds of plastics with more research to be done.
- Ever heard of Mr. Trash Wheel in Baltimore? This is a trash interceptor vessel that is moored in place and keeps trash from entering the ocean, operated by current or solar

power. There are other cities with these trash wheels. On that note, there are also large interceptors sponsored by The Ocean Cleanup. Visit theoceancleanup.com to learn more.

- Culdesac Tempe Read more about this car-free neighborhood
- Ever heard of the AlgaRay robot or the AlgaVator? Seaweed Generation is a group aiming to help keep oceans healthy and keep performing as the large carbon sinks they are

 Permeable or porous pavement -Many cities are eschewing traditional pavement in favor of alternative materials that allow rain and snowmelt to seep through the surface to underlying layers of soil

and gravel.

- Solar canopies on parking lots are being used in more and more places. They can generate clean energy and provide shade for cars at the same time.
- Electric car sales continue to increase across the United States and elsewhere.
