Birth: Preparing for the Unknown

A couple weeks ago we threw an impromptu curbside baby shower for an 18-year-old woman who was due to give birth within weeks and who had "absolutely nothing" for her baby. I heard about this young mother through a local colleague, who heard about her through our mission partner Church on the Street, and then within days a handful of young Spirit of Joy families filled up my Subaru Outback with baby essentials. Because sometimes that's how the Holy Spirit works.

As I drove away from the woman's apartment, I thought of my own baby showers, just a few months back. There were stark differences, to be sure, not least of which because mine occurred before COVID changed everything.

What struck me most, in my reflections, were the similarities. I may not have had a curbside baby shower in the literal sense, but I was equally dependent on the generosity and wisdom of the community. Nearly everything Anja uses and wears is a gift. Most of her clothes are hand-me-downs, as are many of her favorite bouncers and toys. Even our baby registries themselves were a gift: I had hosted two friends for an evening to walk me through what, exactly, the mysterious creature brewing in me would expect to have in her house, and with each item I clicked "Add to Registry."

Though I am literally twice the age of this new mother, save for a few extra years' babysitting experience under my belt, she and I probably entered motherhood with similar degrees of cluelessness. Weeks before Anja was born I asked Jon, in a panic, what type of toothbrush he thought we should buy for her. He gently reassured me that our baby probably wouldn't come out with teeth.

Birth is like that, isn't it? It's always unknown. It's always panic-inducing. It is always, by definition, uncharted territory. It throws all prior expertise and expectations out the window. It makes us utterly dependent on the wisdom of elders and the care of the community.

And so it is this Advent season, this season of preparation for the birth of the Christ child. It's an Advent like no other: the culmination of a whole year of laboring through a global pandemic, racial uprisings, the ongoing climate crisis, and a historically divisive presidential election. We need new birth. Meanwhile the birthing is painful.

May we seek out and receive the gifts we need for this birth and the new life it will bring: the wisdom of elders, the care of the community, and the familiar songs and story of Advent and Christmas. God's peace be yours this Advent.





Just as I sat down to write these words, I received word that the young mother is in labor. By the time you read these words, Lord willing, she will be holding her healthy baby girl.

Spirit of Joy Leadership Team Meeting Minutes November 5, 2020 @ 6:00 p.m. via Zoom

I. Unfinished Business

A. Building Expansion

- 1. Pay Application #8 November 2020: Jodi Hanson moved and Michelle Stanek seconded to approve the payment of \$335,701.35 as noted on the Application and Certificate for Payment from Journey Group Companies (Invoice #201101-08). Motion carried.
- 2. Move in Day to New Offices-November 9th: Discussed other items that have been completed or are nearly completed in the new building.

B. Reopening Church Building Update:

- 1. November: The Reopening Task Force still recommends no in-person worship at this time due to an increase in the number of cases.
- 2. Advent and Christmas: Discussed potential for multiple Christmas services with limited sign-up seating.

C. Coordinator of Communications: Discussed job requirements and compensation. An interview team will interview a qualified applicant within the next week.

II. New Business


- **A.** Boy Scouts of America (BSA) Bankruptcy Impact on Chartering Organizations: Motion by Jodi Hanson and seconded by Carole Chell for Pastor Jeff Eisele to contact a lawyer to get a Proof of Claim regarding the BSA bankruptcy. Motion carried.
- **B.** Letter of resignation from Deacon Katherine Eisele. Discussed ways to thank, honor, and bless her for her service to SoJ.
- C. Youth Ministry Leader: Jon Splichal Larson will be leaving his position as Interim Coordinator of High School Faith Formation. He has recommended an Augustana University student as a short-term replacement. Motion by Lori Tripp and seconded by Jodi Hanson to approve a team to interview an Interim Youth Ministry Leader and if deemed acceptable, the team is authorized to make an offer between \$15-20 per hour for up to 20 hours per week. Motion carried.
- **D. November benevolence:** Michelle Stanek moved and Sarah Manthey seconded to approve the following benevolence payments. Motion carried.

I want to give you all a huge thank you and express my gratitude.

It's been at least 5 years since I've used any food pantry or community assistance. I have worked hard to maintain my home and life and know I'm blessed to have what I do. Even through the close-downs at the beginning of the year, I managed to maintain work mostly.

However, as life is a never ending series of ups and downs, my luck has changed recently. I have been in a jobless limbo for over a month and with a husband who's career is in hotel maintenance (work has been greatly effected but steady enough to not qualify for assistance), our savings and ramen supply was basically depleted.

I didn't expect much when I pulled into your parking lot just days before Thanksgiving, I even cried a little because I was scared and confused about the process of where to park or what I should be doing. But I found you on google and needed help.

When I pulled up to the front of your church, the kindness in the woman's voice who took my information made me feel welcomed and calmer as we joked about face masks, and the interaction, while brief, made me feel better. I didn't see what was put into the back while we chatted, but I drove off feeling uplifted as the surrounding volunteers sent me off with positive well wishes.

And then I got home and saw how much there was! And the first thing I said as my husband approached me was "we have a turkey!" And as he put things away, our amazement only grew by the quality of items provided.

I cannot express what your donation has meant to us: it truly has impacted our lives. Our kitchen has not been this full nor had this many options of actual meals to cook in the 10 years of being together. Nutritious choices and real options.... I'm still in awe.

Not only did you give us meals and options, but you gave us hope. Memories (This was the first time either of us had even cooked a turkey, and our first Thanksgiving dinner we've cooked at home in the 10 years of being together). That wouldn't have happened without you.

Thank you for doing what you do.
