

Peace to you

Grammar and Vocation



For my recent birthday, my parents entrusted me with an extraordinary gift:

A book about grammar. Upon unwrapping it, I squealed with delight. They know me so well.

The book is, specifically, *Dreyer's English:*

An Utterly Correct Guide to Clarity and Style, by Benjamin Dreyer, Copy Chief for Random House Publishing. I highly recommend it.

Striking to me is Dreyer's understanding of the vocation of editor, even if he does not and might not use explicit call language:

When sifting through a written piece, Dreyer does not set out to create something new. Instead he seeks to help the piece become more of itself; to assist the author in more artfully creating what she set out to create in the first place. He does so by reordering sentences for maximum clarity and efficiency, proposing punctuation that avoids potential reader confusion, and ensuring accurate word choice.

I love this idea: helping something become more of what it is. And it seems an apt metaphor for the call of the church, perhaps specifically the call of church partners and leaders (which includes you): helping the Body of Christ become what she is called to be—that is, a community of persons who are loved by our crucified and risen Lord, sent to share God's love with our community and with the world.

The ongoing discernment of the church's ministry requires all-important editorial questions: what needs to be reordered, clarified, maybe even deleted, so that we might more fully and joyfully become who we are?

We are always asking these questions about Spirit of Joy's ministries, and we invite you to join us in that discernment.

Blessings to you, dear sibling in Christ. May you and I become who we are, today and always.








Adult & Family Faith Formation
