That's what I mean when I say that my focus word for the year is "embrace". I want to get past my hesitation and natural resistance to experience the beauty and joy I know is waiting. Complete them. Let your voice be heard.

We begin that process at our Congregation Meeting on Sunday, February 9<sup>th</sup> at 10:00am. Join us in prayer and reflection as we prepare to move forward together as Spirit of Joy!

## OVERVIEW OF STEPS IN SEEKING A NEW PASTOR

The following is an overview of the call process provided by the South Dakota Synod of the ELCA. The comments in italics are the efforts already undertaken by Spirit of Joy. Please join us in prayer throughout the process, beginning on Sunday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### 1. INFORM THE SYNOD OFFICE OF YOUR ROSTERED MINISTER OPENING

a. Have time for prayer and reflection as your congregation goes through this transition.
Pr. Eric notified the Synod Office of our intent to pursue an Associate Pastor on December 23, 2024. A weekly devotion written by Spirit of Joy partners will be shared every Sunday throughout the duration of the Call Process, beginning on Sunday, Feb. 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### 2. ARRANGE FOR PASTORAL ASSISTANCE DURING THE TRANSITION

*Pr. Eric is coordinating with colleagues to preach once each month during the Call Process.* 

#### 3. COMPLETE A CONGREGATIONAL ASSESSMENT

a. Create a call committee.

Election of the Call Committee will take place the Annual Meeting of the Congregation on Sunday, February 9<sup>th</sup>. Leadership Team began considering candidates in December with a particular eye to widespread representation of the partnership of Spirit of Joy. Six candidates have agreed to have their name forwarded to the meeting. Additional nominations will be taken from the floor of the meeting. Those pre-nominated are: Charles Berdahl, Mary Tranberg, Tim Hazlett, Jamie Oyen, Mindy Dold, and Kaelyn Tvinnereim.

b. Complete a Ministry Site Profile (MSP).

- 5. CANDIDATE PROCESS
  - a. Candidate profiles are sent to the call committee for their review.
  - b. Interviews with candidates are scheduled and completed by call committee.

#### 6. RECOMMENDATION

- a. Leadership Team takes action on the recommendation of the call committee
- 7. CONGREGATIONAL MEETING TO VOTE ON THE CANDIDATE
- 8. CANDIDATE DISCERNS CALL
- 9. INSTALLATION

## Liberia Mission Update

The students, parents, and staff of the school (New Dawn Learning Center) in Liberia expressed sincere gratitude to partners and friends of Spirit of Joy for their generous contribution to Liberia's education mission. Your partnership has made significant progress in the lives of the children of Liberia. In September, we opened the school to the community, and sixty-seven students (K-6th Grade) were enrolled; ten teachers and five support staff were hired. Most of our students are from no-income to low-income families. This means most students attend the school on full scholarship with help from donors in the United States. The good news is that sixty-seven children are off the streets and 15 parents can feed their families.

February has been set aside to raise funds for the Liberia mission! Larry Schoeszler will present an update on the Liberia mission on February 2 at 10:00 a.m. in the Shalom Center. We invite you to come, listen, and contribute to our next mission. Our sixth graders will be entering seventh grade and will need classrooms. "God, I'm running for Your heart, I'm running for Your heart, Til I am a soul on fire" – Third Day, "Soul on Fire"

In this month of "burning love," let us use this opportunity to talk more about fire, smoke, and air quality since that has been such a hot topic lately (sorry, that was bad, I know). Have you ever heard of the Air Quality Index (AQI)? It's a scale that measures how clean or how polluted the air is and then conveys the health risks to the public. It looks at 5 major air pollutants (ground level ozone, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, and nitrogen dioxide) and then provides a risk level, a number index scale, and a description of who will be most impacted (airnow.gov has a good visual). An AQI of 100 is considered safe for most people. As you can imagine, the score during the time of a wildfire increases exponentially.

Did you also know that there are two key pollutants which can exacerbate symptoms in individuals with asthma and other lung diseases? Further, studies have shown that air pollution can trigger heart attacks, irregular heart rhythms, and strokes in people already at risk for these conditions. Particle pollution is the biggest culprit. You may even hear about PM 2.5, which refers to particles that are 2.5 microns or smaller and which are exceptionally dangerous as they can penetrate deep into the lungs and even into the bloodstream. When a wildland fire moves through a town, then of course vehicles, houses, and appliances burn emitting a toxic mixture into the air. What ends up in the mix? You have copper from plumbing pipes; lead from car batteries; copper, chromium, and arsenic from pressure-treated lumber; chlorine from plastics; chlorinated compounds from PVC (including phosgene, which is a chemical warfare agent).

Additionally, the heat of a fire influences the types of pollutants released. A smoldering fire, for example, yields gases including carbon monoxide and methane in addition to compounds like formaldehyde and polycyclic aromatic compounds (PAHs), some of which are known to cause cancer and disrupt hormones.

On that note, did you also know that gas stoves emit nitrogen dioxide into the home (see 5 major air pollutants above) and put children at risk for developing asthma? In addition, studies have shown that most gas stoves leak, even when shut off, and when they do they emit nitrogen dioxide, benzene, formaldehyde, and particulate matter (PM), harkening back to the AQI measures above.

How can we help our brothers and sisters impacted by recent fires? We can pray for them daily. We can go to Lutheran Disaster Response ELCA and click on Wildfires.

Do we need to be concerned with fires in South Dakota? The answer is yes. There is an excellent podcast on this topic from South Dakota Public Broadcasting (SDPB) titled <u>Lessons for South Dakota from the California fires</u> that is definitely worth a listen.

In the meantime, practice fire safety, check your smoke detectors, check your fire extinguishers, and have an evacuation plan in the event this would transpire.
