
# **INTRO**

The setting of nearly the entire Christian Bible takes place in a region known as Palestine - what many call the Holy Land. A "promised land" is a major recurring theme in the Old Testament (the Jewish scriptures). The setting of the New Testament's stories of Jesus is this same land. The Book of Acts and letters to churches share

Christianity's beginnings, which radiate outward from the Holy Land. And thousands of years later, conflict in that same land is at the center of international news today.

The history of the region, leading up to and since Israel's declaration of statehood in 1948, has been defined largely by territorial disuptes and violence. Multiple peoples and groups have religious, historical, political, and residential ties to that land, and international sentiments and policies have only complicated...well, just about everything.

The latest violent chapter began on October 7, 2023, with an attack on Israel out of Gaza. An estimated 1,200 Israelis were killed in the attack, and some 250 taken hostage. Israel's response has left over 24,000 dead, according to

Palestinian authorities, among whom two-thirds are thought to be women and children.\*\* This conflict has ignited waves of anti-Palestinian and antisemetic sentiment, with calls for vengeance, justice, ceasefires, and even genocide across the international community.

Christian understandings of the Holy Land and responses to conflict are also complex. General apathy, advocacy for freedom and equity for Palestinians, and American partisan-political support for Israel are just some of the Christian sentiments regarding Israel-Palestine. Some extreme positions view confict in the Holy Land as a sign of end times and Jesus' return. This conversation asks participants to consider and clarify these perspectives.

A few important notes about this Crafted Conversation: this is *not* intended to facilitate a *debate* between Israeli and Palestinian positions. Devastating losses have been inflicted and suffered by both "sides." While you may (and will) certainly bring your opinions, our objective is futhering *understanding* of the people and place of the Holy Land. On the same note, some of the conversation and materials offered reference sources from *prior* to the most recent October 7<sup>th</sup> confict, to emphasize an effort to grasp the wider regional issues, and not the most recent season of violence. With that in mind, *do your homework*, and exercise some curiosity about your world.

# **QUESTIONS TO PONDER**

What do you *know* about Isreal and Palestine? Perhaps more importantly: *what do you not know?* What have you heard or read? Have you ever been forced to relocate? What *place* do you feel most tied to? Has your home or livelihood ever been threatened by an outside force? Do you know any Jews? Muslims? Palestinian Christians? What are their thoughts here? Does your local or wider church have stances or connections to the Holy Land? What is the "right" thing to do for people living in the Holy Land? What do you think Jesus wants?

## **BIBLE BASICS**

- Genesis 12:1-3 The Call of Abram (soon "Abraham"), & the first of many promises of land. Who are his descendants?
- **Jeremiah 32:37-41**, and **Ezekiel 34:11-16** Two places where Zionists (those who advocate for Jews' return to Jerusalem) derive their theology. *Try to find the context for these passages*. What do you make of them?
- Micah 6:8 What God asks of us. How are we doing? (Also: Micah foretells Jesus' city of birth. Where is that today?)
