Acts 2:42-47 ⁴² They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³ Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴ All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵ They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

One of my favorite Christmas events ever was a PEO (Philanthropic Educational Organization) Potluck. We ate and drank, laughed, and sang, until late into the evening. There was much to enjoy, but the highlight of the evening was, without a doubt, the singing of The Twelve Days of Christmas (the season of Christmas is twelve days long, beginning at Christmas Day and ending at the Wisemen's appearance on Epiphany- Jan. 6). Each of the twelve days had a different group assigned to sing it every time that it came around, and they were given secret actions and sounds to make along with their part. It probably took ten minutes or more to sing the song, but every second was worth it. Bad voices joined good voices. Dignified older gentlemen squawked and danced right next to the young female scholarship recipients. Snorts of laughter and tears of joy filled the room. It was great. But, why? What made it such a special experience and what can we learn from it that will continue to make Spirit of Joy such a special place in 2022 and beyond?

I think the first important ingredient was a comfortable space. The event was held in the fellowship hall of a small congregation that had spent years welcoming people into its building. So, members or not, everyone had been in the building previously. They'd experienced hospitality at fellowship events and community meetings, and knew that it would be clean, safe, appropriately decorated, and welcoming. There were none of the uncomfortable moments of searching for coat racks or restrooms, so they could focus on each other.

Many in this group knew each other, but not all. What they did all share, was a willingness to welcome all. While there were deep friendships and

those people spent time with each other, they also went out of their way to greet everyone. And, that **welcome didn't stop with a handshake and exchange of names.** It included staying by their side and explaining the agenda for the evening and helping them make connections with others.

Next, I think they were present for something that mattered to them. For many, their reason to attend was to raise funds for scholarships for women. Others were out for a good time. For those who were interested in the fundraising aspect there was an

abundance of information, a persuasive reason to give, and a clear goal. Those just out for a good time found ample food, drinks, activities, and people. The rationale may have been slightly different, but they came together for a singular event and purpose.

That would not have been the case, though, if they had not been willing to participate. From the moment that you walked in the door; everyone was involved. There were greeters and hosts. Some were running the kitchen while others ran the auction tables. Certain gifted people told the story of their organization and the impact of their gifts. That's great. We have all been to events like that. But what really made that evening special was their willingness to participate in a way that might have been uncomfortable. When the hospital CEO and his wife pushed their elbows back, lifted their heads, and kissed (two turtledoves) it gave one final permission for the entire room to fully relax, be vulnerable with each other, and be present in the moment in a rich and unusual way.

Spirit of Joy has shared many moments like this in its history. It's why so many of you are here. And I'd like to call you into those qualities, back into those moments, and deeper into those practices for 2022. It is our goal that 2022 will be a year of re-engagement and new growth. Here are a few ways and places that you can continue to grow in your discipleship to experience moments like the one described above.

Our space is gorgeous and welcoming. We're working on signs and getting art on the walls. We continue to welcome

new guests for worship and building users throughout the week. But we need your help. If you see or experience something we can do better, tell us, or better yet, take care of it! And you will hear in the coming days of a debt reduction campaign set to begin this Lent. This is a chance to continue living into our core value of Extravagant Generosity. I hope that you will prayerfully consider blessing all of those who

enter our building with a comfortable experience for years to come!

To show up on Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings, and in between. To share your gifts, in ways that we've always served, and in ways that we've not yet imagined. Relax, be vulnerable with each other, and be present in the moment in a rich and unusual way, there you will find a Spirit of Joy!

Walking with Jesus Milestone—Sunday, January 30




