

Tell us a little about your background

I grew up on a farm 22 miles north of Winner, SD. On the farm, I helped work with cattle, put up hay, and farm our various crops. While I was in high school, I was in football, basketball, track, band, choir, FFA, FCA, and student council. I even played on our 2009 state championship football team! After high school, I went on to South Dakota State University to study music education with an emphasis in piano. Following my undergraduate studies, I earned my graduate degree in collaborative piano from North Dakota State University. During both my time in undergraduate and graduate studies, I was employed by a number of churches serving as their accompanist, organist, choir director, handbell director, and music director.

June 16, 2022 @ 6:30 p.m. at Spirit of Joy

I. Unfinished Business

- A. Welcome, Ordination and Installation for Deacon Candidate Hannah Fleming: Discussed plans for welcoming Hannah Fleming to SoJ, including potential gifts for her ordination. Pastor Jeff will follow up with several of the gift ideas. Moving expenses were approved to be paid with Thrivent Choice restricted funds at the May meeting (\$3100). Pastor Jeff and Deacon Katherine plan to host a potluck picnic for Hannah and her family, the SoJ leadership team and SoJ staff on Thursday, July 7th at the Eisele home.
- B. Audit Committee Nominees: Erik Syverson, Tracy Dahl Webb, Payton Larsen: Kendra Krueger moved and Jason Ahrendt seconded to elect the named individuals as the Audit Committee. Motion carried. They will begin the audit in July 2022.
