## Greetings from Pastor Eric

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus who is the Christ!

It is such a joy and privilege to be writing to you this morning. It is my first official day as a partner in mission and ministry with you and I want to take a moment to introduce myself and invite you to do the same.

I grew up in Lewiston, ID. My parents, Dr.'s Dennis and Carol were high school teachers of Spanish, English, and a number of other subjects. Dad was our church Choir Director and mom taught the Crossroads education series and served on multiple Call Committees including as Chair. Among many other things, they valued music, exposure to different people and cultures, and community involvement. I took piano and trumpet lessons growing up, sang in the church choir, and have since taught myself to play a rudimentary bass guitar. I also had the good fortune to travel with my parents across the U.S. and spent a summer living in Morelia, Mexico. They taught us service and care for others through participation in Kiwanis, Meals on Wheels, and many other civic groups.

My sisters, Dr. Loralee and Heather, are 10 and 8 years older than I. Loralee is the Director of Laboratories for Lewis Clark State College in my hometown and Heather teaches Family and Consumer Sciences. We all sang in choir and I played all sports growing up, but my true love was and is baseball.

I moved into Solberg Hall at Augustana on my 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. My dad's family is from northwest Iowa (Algona, Jolly, Lytton, Fort Dodge, etc) and he attended Augie in the 60's before my oldest sister, Loralee and I decided to attend. I majored in Religion and Spanish, spending most of my time studying non-Christian religions with Dr. Murray Haar. I spent my summers working as a camp counselor at Luther Heights Bible Camp in central Idaho.

I met my wife, Krista, during first day orientation to Solberg Hall, we had our first date on Valentine's Day of our sophomore year, and got engaged a year later. We were married in her hometown, Detroit Lakes, MN, shortly after graduation and spent our "honeymoon" driving to Berkeley, CA where I attended Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. In the 18 years that we have been married Krista and I have lived in 5 states and moved 10 times. We moved back to Sioux Falls in March of 2017 when Krista was hired as the Access Services Librarian at Augustana. Our kids, Jonah and Elsa, are 15 and 13.



My life in ministry has been mostly in smaller congregations. My first exposure to professional ministry was at Christ Lutheran Church in El Cerrito, CA. Rev. Sharon Lubkeman was an incredible mentor and encouraged me as I continued discernment during my time at the seminary. My internship was served at Cormorant Lutheran Church in rural Lake Park, MN. Rev. Lori Beck was my supervising pastor, and it was my first exposure to a larger congregation. I came to treasure shared ministry. My first call was to St. Paul Lutheran in Colville, WA. I served as the solo pastor there for 9.5 years. St. Paul taught me so much, but perhaps nothing greater than the call to public ministry. During that time, I served on City Council, on the Board of the Senior Center, and Synod Council (7 years), Synod Constitution Committee, was the co-founder of a PFLAG chapter, a Warming Shelter, and a HUD 202 Senior Housing Project. I coached 18 youth sports teams and eventually became the Commissioner of Kiwanis Youth Baseball for the area. St. Paul embraced my participation and welcomed the community into their community and facility in a way that transformed their mission and ministry, as well as their membership. Most recently, I served as the solo pastor for just over 4 years at Messiah New Hope Lutheran here in Sioux Falls. While I continued to serve the larger church on the Synod Assembly Planning Team, the Synod Constitution Committee,

and the Synod Hunger Grant Review Team, much of our work together was spent in stabilizing their community and doing the hard work of investing in their infrastructure while reducing their debt. It is a beautiful little congregation, and I will forever pray for them.

I am very much looking forward to the transition into this next phase of my life in ministry with you at Spirit of Joy. Already, I have been energized by working with Pr. Jeff, Heather, Ron, and all of the rest of the staff and Leadership Team. I can not wait to dig in to Creating a Culture of Calling and to live into the 5 Priorities with you. I am excited to get to know each of you and to discover your passions, your visions, and your desires for who we can be together as SoJ. And, it's on that note, that I end. Please join us at the meet and greet events this month. Reach out to me to schedule a visit. I like coffee, most adult beverages, lunch and a relaxed dinner, visits to your home, and visits in my office. I understand my first and most significant task to be getting to know you as individuals, and as a whole. So, thank you, for calling me to be a partner with you. Thank you for taking the lead in getting to know each other. And, thank you for being a part of Spirit of Joy.
