#### Welcome to Spirit of Joy

Almost exactly two years ago, I was visiting a Spirit of Joy ministry partner in the hospital. It was just a couple days after the congregation's vote on whether to call me as your associate pastor.

Given this partner's health circumstances, he had been unable to participate in the vote. When I arrived in his ICU room, he eagerly asked for the results.

"They voted to call me," I reported. In response, he offered his hand. "Welcome to Spirit of Joy," he said, accompanied by a firm shake.



That gesture, and its corresponding greeting, continue to be one of my most cherished moments in ministry. There we were, in the most unglamorous of settings: the ICU. And there was Spirit of Joy.

As this gentleman inherently knew and

reminded me, Spirit of Joy is not a building. She is a Spirit-formed community. She exists wherever we are and wherever God calls us to be. She is in hospital rooms, locker rooms, homes, airports, and cars. She is at the State Penitentiary, the Banquet, Bridges at Horace Mann Elementary School, the LSS Center for New Americans, and Feeding South Dakota.

She is also at 2208 West LaQuinta Street.

Spirit of Joy is not confined to a building, *and* she exists within a building. She gathers her people in a designated place for worship and faith formation. She lives outside of our building walls *and* within them, where together we hear the Word of God, break bread, and drink coffee. She resides in a place that sends us to other places, to follow the Jesus who loves us and calls us in many and varied ways.

This month we enter "Called in Faith, Growing in Joy," a capital campaign to raise funds for expanding the walls on 2208 West LaQuinta Street: this place--not the *only* place--where Spirit of Joy exists. Campaign gifts will help us welcome more neighbors into the life of this community: this community who will share in their joys and sorrows, who will tell them God loves them, who will empower them to love their neighbors, and who will hold out their hands and welcome them home.

Welcome to Spirit of Joy.

These are all ideas that we'll soon start to tackle... starting with a planning team of HS parents and teens. So what can you add to the list? How can you be a person of influence and future thinking for our teens?

Participate in the event however it works best for your family: join the Bike-a-Thon fundraiser; play outside on the playground with chalk and bubbles; or explore the preschool classroom toys. Or try all 3! Bikes, trikes, scooters, strollers, and wagons are welcome.

#### Our Goal:

To raise funds to purchase Kindermusik curriculum as an addition to current Preschool programming. Kindermusik curriculum offers a joyful music experience that encourages learning and development for young children. #### February was short but sweet.

The month always zooms by, but this year it was particularly fast because of a few snow days and holiday break at Preschool. However, we were still able to pack in sweet activities.

In keeping with one of the key messages of Spirit of Joy, "all people matter to God and so they matter to us" (or at Preschool, we say "We take care of each other"), the month began with exploring friendship. Preschool classes discovered the Bible story of two friends David and Jonathan. Games, crafts, snacks, and centers offered preschoolers opportunities to work and play as friends. The theme closed with a Valentine's Day celebration shared with parents, siblings, and classmates.

In the middle of the month, parent/teacher conferences were held. Conferences provide time to connect with each other without the hurried schedules of pick up and drop off. I treasure the time and conversation with families.



We also learned about Jesus' calling his disciples. Jesus said, "follow me" and they stopped what they were doing and followed. After hearing the story, children played the game "follow the leader." Then we shared the love of God with others just like the disciples. Heart stickers were delivered to whomever was visiting the building with a message- "Jesus loves you" -- a wonderful message both to share and hear.

February 2019 Hospitality/Outreach/Communications

Charis Ministries: Are you aware of what the mission of Charis Ministries is, who it serves, and how SoJ is a partner in this?

Charis ministries is a non-profit organization formed by 13 partner ELCA churches in the Sioux Falls area. These congregations are essentially the owners and operators of this business in which we work together and pool our resources, time, and talent by working together to decrease hunger in the Sioux Falls area and assist our neighbors in meeting essential needs. There are actually three partnerships that Charis focuses on:

- Food to You Mobile Food Pantry: this ministry offers food on a monthly basis to those in need. Distribution takes place every Thursday at one of four partnering churches in Sioux Falls that donate their space. Households may use Mobile Food to You 1x/month, choosing which Thursday location they would like to pick up food items such as meat, milk, produce, bread, commodity items, and the food of the month which by the way, our SoJ men's group collects funds and purchases this food each month and donates this for distribution. SoJ is responsible in this partnership to sponsor and serve as honorary host 3x/year. Our funds given purchase food at special discounted pricing through Feeding SD to ensure the grocery essentials are there for these families. To give you an example of the need in this community, during the month of January alone over 310 families came to utilize this ministry.
- 2. Necessities for Neighbors: This operates now out of two locations providing essential items not covered by SNAP/WIC for families or individuals that have a need for items such as laundry detergent, feminine hygiene products, toilet pater, diapers, and other essentials. These items are distributed and funding comes from donations from churches (our toilet paper drive each fall), schools collecting these hygiene items, and some money given from the hosting church to help offset costs of these products. SoJ's commitment to this ministry is through a financial donation as well as serving in the distribution at one of the locations 1x/year. Charis recently added the second distribution site to meet the needs of the city and is looking at a variety of ways to help with funding to continue to meet this ever-growing need in our community. In January, Necessities for Neighbors served 335 families.
- 3. Healthy Rides/Project Car: A transportation system providing safe, efficient transportation for SF citizens who are involved in activities scheduled by supporting organizations and may include things like getting to doctors' appointments, senior companion and retired senior volunteer program volunteers to their assignments, or assist clients of SD Achieve or Dakotabilities to get to their assignments or special scheduled activities. Funding for this program at this time is through businesses and specialized grants and support. 84 rides were given to those in need in the month of January.

Currently, Angie Schrader is the SoJ representative on the Charis Ministries board. This board meets monthly to plan, problem solve and assist in keeping this organization funded and running efficiently to meet the ever-growing need in our community for these services. We look at the bylaws, make adjustments and advancements to the current programs to best meet the needs or our community and focus on how to effectively work to provide the funds and resources needed to run our 13 churches business. If you have any questions regarding this ministry, want to be more involved, or would like to make a personal donation towards the monthly needs and supplies utilized to support the ministry, please do not hesitate to contact me, as I'd be happy to visit more with you about this.
