Grace to you and peace from God our Creator, Jesus our Savior, and the Holy Spirit who continues to do amazing things with Spirit of Joy!

I'm writing this as the third of our dessert gatherings for Overflowing! A Debt Reduction Campaign is underway. As we have shared with those able to gather for these events, I have heard two consistent refrains. First, "I'm so glad that we're investing in mission and ministry, not just keeping the lights on." And, second, "I didn't know we were doing that!" As you peruse the pages of this newsletter, you'll see a lot that speaks to both of those refrains. I want to tell the stories of a few others.

We have a wonderful group of women who gather to play Mah Jongg every Wednesday afternoon. The size of the group varies with the seasons, but right now its 12-16 most weeks. What's important about their gathering is their caring and joyful conversation. They ask after each other and offer care that matters. And, they have taken to closing the door because they worry that their laughter bothers us staff!

Our Moms with a Purpose group meets early in the day on Wednesday for study and caring conversation. As their group has grown to 7-8 they have begun to incorporate fellowship and service opportunities. Recently, they partnered with Thrivent Financial to provide more than a dozen Easter baskets for LifeScape.

The Spirit of Joy Woodworkers have been meeting regularly since January to make the internal parts for pediatric wheelchairs in partnership with Hope Haven International. 16-18 men have made more than 3000 parts. For summer they're turning their attention to the more intricate trays for the chairs and a playhouse for the Spirit of Joy preschool.

Spirit of Joy hosts a troop of both Boy and Girl Scouts. While they regularly meet, they do so much more. The girls have been key volunteers at Food to You and Necessities for Neighbors. The boys have helped build raised beds, recycle aluminum cans, and spread mulch around the campus. Recently, more than 200 people gathered at SoJ for their annual Pinewood Derby!

High Plains Woodwinds is a community band that practices at Spirit of Joy every Monday night. A dream of our partner, Sharon Lehmann, the band has been in existence for ten years. 20 or more adults from SD, MN, and IA gather for the blessing of playing music and regularly perform around the area.

Auditions and rehearsal for a youth play. Space for students to study. A new deacon and musician. Milestones galore. This is just a tiny sample. I am in awe of the many wonders God works through you. I am glad for the ways you gather together. I celebrate the goodwill you have built with your partners. And, I can't wait to see how God overflows in, through, and from you!

A Summer of Brene Brown w/ Margie Schade June 9, July 7, August 11 | 7 PM @ SoJ



Preschool Teaching Moments

Each year, the children and I spend Holy Week talking about a different part of the story each day. Together, we learn the story and try to experience portions of the events in different ways. For example, the class walked the halls of the church waving palms and shouting "HOSANNA". Paper Easter baskets were created containing a variety of paper eggs. Each color representing one part of the story- green for palm branches, brown for the tomb, etc.

As we read the story about Jesus washing the disciples' feet, the children listened closely. We talked about Jesus' words and how we could serve others. Then we tried it. Children were given a wet wipe and a partner. Taking turns, the partners washed one another's shoes with the wipe.

When asked how it felt to wash another's feet the children remarked "it was silly" and others mentioned "it was fun to help". There was a commitment and determination to help the other person. "Just let me get that one more spot there." Or "Wait, I need to check all the sides for you." Consistently, the children preferred helping others to being served. The children's joy was a reminder of how serving fulfills all those involved. Thank you for the teaching moment, preschool



From the Bishop's Desk

Dear SD Synod,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit!

Driving across the State I can see that we are pretty dry. I pray for rain and moisture to water our parched lands. I also lift up prayers for our ranchers and farmers. It's not only the land that is parched, but spirits can run dry too. You may remember that in the very first months of my term you were invited to a farm summit in Mitchell SD. We shared in the joys and challenges of farming and ranching, learned about resources, and were assured that God's always close at hand. At the same time of the farm summit, I also collaborated with Lutheran Social Services in SD. We partnered to offer Mental Health First Aid training to our leaders so that they can learn about the first signs of distress. But we also developed a web-based tool called Psychological First Aid. It is designed with your neighbor in mind. You can take this web-based training at your pace and at your time. It strives to equip you with what you need to read early warning signs of mental health issues, and gives you tools to be a good neighbor to your neighbor. Last but not least, many ask about how to best support the Ukrainian refugees. At this time your monetary gifts to Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) or Lutheran World Relief (LWR) are the best help you can provide as they aid relief efforts on the ground. Our ministry partner LSS is in close communication with the federal government to see how to best assist refugees that will find their way to the United States. Watch your enews for regular updates.

April 21, 2022 @ 6:30 p.m. at Spirit of Joy

I. Unfinished Business

- A. Recommendation to Call Deacon Candidate Hannah Fleming: Following a discussion regarding the Call Committee recommendation and a compensation package, Kendra Krueger moved and Heather Krzmarzick seconded to call Deacon candidate Hannah Fleming as the full-time Director of Faith Formation. Motion carried. This will be brought before SOJ partners on May 1, 2022 for approval.
- B. Call committee Rationale: See V-A above C. **Compensation Package:** See V-A above.
- D. Overflowing! Building Debt Reduction Appeal-Outreach Options: Voting for the top outreach partners will take place on both Sunday and Wednesday.

II. New Business

- B. Additional Payment of Principal on MIF Building Loan: Andrew Hewitt moved and Amy Eisenbeisz seconded to use \$100,000 from the Land and Building fund to pay down the principle on the building loan. Motion carried. This will bring the total debt to less than 2 million dollars and leave approximately 9 months of expenses in the account.
- III. Meeting Review and Lord's Prayer: The meeting was adjourned following the Lord's Prayer.
