Alleluia! Christ is risen!

We continue in the season of Easter. It began with the breathing of the Holy Spirit in the Gospel of John and will continue until Pentecost Sunday on May 28th. Through the season we have been praying, "Come, Holy Spirit." Slowly, we have woven more of that language into our liturgy and conversations as we move from the joy of the resurrected Christ to the ongoing movement of the Holy Spirit.

Initially, that movement was small. Christ's words were to go and baptize, make disciples, everywhere. Instead, hidden and scared, disciples and new converts gathered in homes and synagogues to share their experiences of the

resurrected Christ. As time wore on and those who had experienced Jesus joined him in the resurrection the Spirit got to work. Communities developed their own rhythms and spaces to meet. Leadership structures were put into place. Doctrine and theology was developed. The state got involved and so did reformers, at first it was monks and nuns settled into lives of mystery and prayer removed from the need to be supported by far flung judicatories who named the straying and failings of the church. Finally, a German professor and monk was joined by a prince and a cadre of powerful colleagues across the Holy Roman Empire. His writing, the princes' power and political ability, and the other's influence changed all that had come before. And still the Spirit moved. Through the horrors of colonialism and the power of European empires, the Spirit worked. Church and nation began to separate, first slowly, then rapidly. Leaders like Muhlenberg, Walther, and Tindall shaped a new way of being church that flipped the power structures upside down. No longer would local congregations be dictated to by a distant office, now the local congregation would shape and lead those offices. A spark ignited and the Spirit blew. Then leaders like King, Graham, Tutu, and Theresa began to show the world that our faith must be love for the least of these, willing not just to worship the one who died on the cross, but to pick up our own, willing to give our lives like His. And the Spirit roared.

Today, that movement looks like Spirit of Joy. As you serve at St. Dysmas and Church on the Street, you stand with those who went before. When you step up for our planet and our neighbors you proclaim your faith out loud. When you use your influence as blessing, you make disciples. When you practice our values, you answer the call of the Spirit first received on the day of Pentecost. Come, Holy Spirit to Spirit of Joy... and to the world.

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit.



It's gardening season!! Time for planting, sowing, and reaping flowers, vegetables, grasses, trees – all good living things which sustain our earthly bodies.

Did you know that soil is a source of life and is filled with living things? In fact, scientists sometimes refer to soil as "earth's living skin." Soil helps to produce our food, filter and purify water, reduce flooding, and helps regulate the atmosphere as it plays a role with carbon and nitrogen cycles. Soil is actually a carbon "sink" as it can capture and store carbon, as long as the soil has not been depleted of its organic matter.

Did you know that you can use compost to build healthier soil, inhibit soil erosion, lower water usage, and enhance plant growth and yield? You can also sprinkle it on your lawn or amend the soil of your houseplants with it. Further, when you compost you are decreasing the volume that ends up in the landfill. Food waste, leaves, yard clippings, grass, clippings and other items typically get buried under massive

amounts of other trash in a landfill, which results in methane gas being released into the atmosphere. If we instead take our food waste and other materials to make compost, we reduce the amount of methane gas being produced and we make healthier soil in the long run, which has many benefits to us and the environment.

We have a wonderful opportunity to "be good soil" and make good soil as a drop-off site with SoDak Compost. Please visit their website at https://www.sodakcompost.org/ to learn more about this fantastic organization and why this is so essential to our work as Lutherans Restoring Creation.


