# Lifelong Faith FORMATION

We are continuing to develop Little Lambs on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of each month. Our preschool is near capacity this year and beginning to think about growth in the near future. Children of Joy gave 22 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students Bibles last month. Middle

School Confirmation is leading the way for Trunk or Treat. High School Youth Group went to the Jaycee Feargrounds and continues to grow. 27 women attended this year's retreat at Joy Ranch. There are three new Bible Studies this fall and you'll see that we have new opportunities for retreat this winter and spring.

### Passionate WORSHIP

Includes a return to our roots for Reformation Sunday, All Saint's, and Christ the King. Meanwhile, we'll celebrate the Walk of Remembrance on Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> and look forward to the return of Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesdays in Advent beginning on November 30<sup>th</sup>. In that season we'll mark a Blue Christmas and

prep for three services on Christmas Eve. Our musicians are planning special music, including cello, trumpet, and violin. Our Visual Arts Team is just getting underway, but they'll soon add physical beauty to our worship experience.



We continue to serve our neighbors. This month we're headed to The Banquet and collecting Toilet Paper for Necessities for Neighbors (N-Z is going to win!). Next month, Necessities is on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday and we'll be collecting with the kids for "Warm Hearts, Warm Hands". We're in conversation with LSS about accompanying a refugee family in

resettlement. We've added three new partners to our 2023 Proposed Mission Plan. And, we're working to tighten and improve each of our relationships with our partner organizations.

Establish and Endowment Fund. A team has been built. They're meeting with representatives from the Synod. And, together, they are dreaming about Spirit of Joy's future, 20, 30, and 50 years from today.

addition, they are ready to invest in telling Spirit of Joy's story. Hopefully you've seen and shared our Mission Guide, a 30,000ft view of our Mission and Ministry. Soon, renewed, reimagined, and reinvigorated evangelism efforts!

4th graders and parents are given opportunity to explore the ways we give back to God - our treasures and talent. Specifically, at this milestone, money will be discussed.



Spirit of Joy has been invited to partner with LSS to help welcome the family to our community! This has been part of the Outreach Team budget for a number of years but arrivals were fewer related to the presidential determination of how many refugees would be allowed into the US and the COVID crisis.

#### I. Unfinished Business

- A. **2023 Budget:** The preliminary 2023 budget was reviewed and discussion followed regarding where funding should be focused during the next year. The Leadership Team will finalize the budget and prepare it for congregational review/vote at the next meeting.
- B. **Congregation Meetings:** A congregational meeting will be held on November 20, 2022 to approve the 2023 budget and elect new officers. A congregation meeting will be held on December 4, 2022 to vote on calling a lead pastor.
- C. **Ministry Site Profile:** After review of the MSP, it was decided that Evangelism/Mission should replace Innovation/ Creativity as one of the five most critical tasks required for the lead pastor position (MSP, p.9). Chad Wolff moved and Jodi Hanson seconded to approve the MSP as amended. Motion carried.
- **III. Meeting Review and Lord's Prayer:** The meeting was adjourned following the Lord's Prayer.

## Take Note

### Call Committee Update

Your Call Committee met for the first time on Sunday, October 2. We walked through the steps needed to call a Lead Pastor to Spirit of Joy. It is important to note that even though we are considering one person for this position, Pastor Eric Ohrtman, we also want to take the proper steps for calling a Lead Pastor. This will be the first time for Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church to have this opportunity since we began as a Mission Start with Pastor Jeff Eisele bringing us together.

Three of our members have finished writing the Ministry Site Profile describing the ministry in this place and the type of leadership that is needed. That work was completed and voted on by the rest of the Call Committee on Sunday, October 16 and the Leadership Team on Thursday, October 20.

On Sunday, October 23, Pr. Jonathan Steiner (Associate to the Bishop) was at Spirit of Joy to share a brief look at our geographical area and the options we have in growing our ministry in this place. At some point we will schedule a Site Study with Pr. Renee Splichal Larson, Associate to the Bishop, to join the Call Committee, Staff, and Leadership Team. Following that we will interview Pr. Eric Ohrtman for the position of Lead Pastor. This is for him to share with the Call Committee how he will see his role as Lead Pastor here at Spirit of Joy.

On November 17, we will make our recommendation to the Leadership Team at their regular meeting. The congregation will vote on the call for the position of Lead Pastor to Spirit of Joy on December 4 at 10:00 a.m. between services.






We meet the 1st Tuesday each month in the SoJ Library. We read a variety of books and love to socialize too. Didn't read the book? Come anyway!
