Spirit of Joy Leadership Team Meeting Minutes

October 15, 2020 @ 6:30 p.m. via Zoom

I. Unfinished Business

A. Building Expansion

- 1. Pay Application #7 October 2020: Lori Tripp moved and Ron Risty seconded to approve the payment of \$631,452.59 as noted on the Application and Certificate for Payment from Journey Group Companies (Invoice #201101-07). Motion carried.
- 2. Additional Landscaping Proposal(s): Plans for adding a patio to the north of the building was discussed. Bids were obtained for several sizes and shapes of patios. Ron Risty moved and Jodi Hanson seconded to increase the size of the patio to a maximum payment of \$10,000 and have the Garden Committee determine final finishes for the patio. Motion carried.
- 3. **Kitchen Remodel:** Sarah Manthey moved and Carole Chell seconded to approve \$4300.00 for kitchen furnishings. Motion carried.
- 4. **Contingency Fund:** There is \$190,000 in the contingency fund. Discussion followed to prioritize a "wish list." 1) Flooring for fellowship hall potentially hard surface flooring for easy cleaning. Brad Tams will check on pricing. 2) Flooring for classrooms and offices also potential hard surface flooring; 3) LED lighting for fellowship hall and remainder of original building. Darlene Weber Scott will obtain a new bid. No other action taken at this time.
- **B.** Reopening Church Building Update: Due to increasing numbers of COVID-19 in the community, opening for large groups for indoor services will continue to be delayed. There are several small groups that are using the building for various reasons. Two confirmation services will be held for up to 50 persons for confirmation students and their families. SoJ will be a polling place on election day.
- **C. Mission Plan Preparation-Executive Team Staff Reviews:** The Leadership Team will meet at 6 p.m. on Thursday, November 5, 2020 to prepare the mission plan. The Executive Team (Darlene Weber Scott, Carole Chell, Lori Tripp, and Ron Risty) will complete staff evaluations within the next 2 weeks. Budget items need to be to Michelle Stanek before the meeting.

II. New Business

- A. **Annual Fall Congregational Meeting- Date, Time and Manner of Gathering:** The annual fall congregational meeting will be held via Zoom on November 22, 2020 from 9-10 a.m.
- B. **ELCA Portico Health Care Plan Options for 2021:** Carole Chell moved and Ron Risty seconded to continue coverage with the Gold level plan. Motion carried.
- C. Letter of Resignation from Audrey Shattuck: Audrey has submitted her resignation effective October 29, 2020. She will be moving to Kansas. Discussion followed regarding hiring a replacement for the position. Carole Chell moved and Sarah Manthey seconded giving Audrey a \$100 gift card. Motion carried.
- D. **October Benevolence:** Jodi Hanson moved and Lori Tripp seconded to approve the following benevolence payments. Motion carried.

Food to You – As per invoice, LSS - \$500, ELCA World Hunger - \$1000, Pueblo de Dios - \$1000, Lutheran Church of Nicaragua - \$1000

III. Meeting Review and Lord's Prayer: The meeting was adjourned following the Lord's Prayer.

Next Leadership Team Meeting is scheduled for **Thursday, November 5 at 6:00 p.m.**We will finalize a proposed mission plan for 2021 at this meeting.

Faith Formation This Month



Some of the themes this month have included- Colors & Shapes, Fire Safety, Construction Work, Pumpkins & the Bible story of Joseph's life. Some of our best/favorite moments:

- Coloring mixing At the art center, children were offered primary colors in paint. By adding a little of this and a little of that, new colors were discovered. "What will happen if I add blue to this color, Miss Amy?" Of course, we tried it and found the answer right away!
- Special Visitors- With all the projects inside and outside the building, the class began asking questions about construction. We went for walks to see the progress from a distance. Construction Team members from down the hall also came for a visit. The guests answered our questions and told us about their jobs.
- This month's Chapel story is about Joseph from the book of Genesis. The story is memorable for so many reasons- a coat of many colors, a brother thrown into a hole, and a pharaoh's crazy dreams. 
