I'm so grateful to our Stewardship Team (Brad Bass, Rachael Flagstad, Rev. Lon Kvanli) for introducing me to these verses and thinking about it with me. Not only is it a description of God's blessing for us as humanity, but I believe it to be an appropriate vision for us as church. How do we, as a community of believers, reflect this vision? How do we share blessing that does not fizzle, but overwhelms? How do we create space, side by side, for all forms of life? How do we embrace our differences and together call it Kingdom of God?

This month we're asking you to join us in doing difficult work. Setting the path for us to move "Forward Together". It started with our meeting, conversation, and feedback on Oct. 29th. It continues with Commitment Sunday on Nov. 10 and our Congregation Meeting on Nov. 24 (ONE WORSHIP SERVICE AT 9:30AM— MEETING TO FOLLOW). The decisions that we make individually, and as a whole, will lead us into 2025 and beyond.

As you make your decision and we make our decisions, I ask for a few things from you:

- 1. **Prayer** our way forward must be rooted in our relationship with God. Please lift up Spirit of Joy, its partners, its staff, and its Ministry Partners every day.
- 2. **Commitment** show up. Participate here and now. But, most importantly, commit to being an active part of the work we do in 2025 and 2026 that we will call "Forward Together".
- 3. **Creativity** the church as a whole is not what it was... even 10 years ago. We can't discover where the Holy Spirit is leading us by seeking to go backward and reclaim a moment in the past, no matter how beautiful. We can look for God's visible presence in your ideas and by prayer and careful reflection lay the groundwork for blessings that overflow
- 4. **Inclusion** share with your friends and family how important this moment is for us as a community. Invite them in. What we're looking for requires all, the trees and the plants, the fish and the animals, the fresh and the marshy.

Thank you, Spirit of Joy, for being a community willing to do this level of work. You are a blessing to me, as you are a blessing to so many.

It is that time of year to begin planning yearend charitable giving. For our seasoned Partners that includes Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) and Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs). IRA owners age 70½ or over can transfer up to \$100,000 to charity "tax-free" each year through QCDs if paid directly from their IRA. And, for those who are at least 73 years old, QCDs count toward the IRA owner's RMD for the year. You may want to talk with your financial advisor, CPA or attorney about the best way to do these types of charitable giving.

Don't forget: From now until the end of the year, any donations made to the Mission Endowment Fund will be matched by an anonymous donor, doubling the impact up to \$20,000.

Who makes the wind?

"The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." (John 3:8)

While it is true that humans and human activity can impact weather and worsen hurricanes by the burning of fossil fuels (which generate a hotter atmosphere and increase the temperature of the oceans, thereby feeding hurricanes more energy to brandish greater fury on humans in their path of destruction), we most certainly cannot control the weather. However, we can and do influence weather patterns and climate by our actions and choices. This appears to be catching up with us. Will we meet this moment?

"...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Galatians 5:22)

Both Helene and Milton rapidly intensified over record-high water temperatures in the Gulf of Mexico. The hurricanes may seem distant to us but the ramifications are far-reaching. Did you know that there is a critical shortage of IV fluids for hospitals right now because of damage sustained at the Baxter International factory in North Carolina?

How can we help our neighbors affected by these hurricanes? A good place to start is Lutheran Disaster Relief. We can also lift them up in prayer – and then pray some more.

Change is blowing in the wind. Will you be forced to give up things you love because of continued disasters? Will you be forced to move? Will others be forced to move to your area and change your way of life as they become displaced secondary to human-influenced disasters?

So many swirling questions in the air...

You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your fathers, as it is this day. And if you forget the Lord your God and go after other gods and serve them and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you shall surely perish." (Deuteronomy 8:17-19)

Let us open our hearts and minds to the Spirit that blows in, around, behind us, and through us, leading us into community and relationship with God.

Volunteers Needed for Meals on Wheels!

Meals on Wheels is a good community service project designed to help people remain in their own homes with improved nutrition. Spirit of Joy has been part of Meals on Wheels for many years – even through the pandemic.

- 1. We work in teams of two one to drive and one to run the meals up to the houses. If you sign up alone, you will be assigned a partner. First time help with route is available.
- 2. Each team works once every three months, always on Mondays and always in the middle of the day. If the schools are cancelled for bad weather, Meals on Wheels is also cancelled.
- 3. We have Route 8, which starts on 57th & Cliff (near the Hy-Vee) and extends southward. This is a nice safe neighborhood and easy and convenient to park.
- 4. Meals are picked up at the Center for Active Generations on 49th Street by 10:45AM. There will be between 15 and 20 names on your list. We usually finish between 12:15 & 12:30, then return the empty containers to the Center.
- 5. Remember to bring a cell phone. GPS works great to find addresses. The book with the names has some directions.
