Reclaiming the "E" Word

The tweet was stunning, coming from one of the bishops of our *Evangelical* Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Bishop Jim Hazelwood of the New England Synod reacted to a *New York Times* headline about what "frustrated evangelical leaders" want in the supreme court nomination process by tweeting, "Yet another example why the ELCA should drop the E."



The term "evangelical" has, in recent decades, come to be associated with a very specific kind of Christianity focused on a handful of public policy issues such as abortion and gun control. It's become a sad hijacking of a word that comes from the

Greek word *euangelion*, which simply means "good news" or "gospel." Most references to "evangelicals" today miss the grand, historic meaning of the term: people who embrace and share the "good news" of Jesus

that we are loved by God and saved by God's grace through faith, not by anything we do.

We Lutheran Christians have been referred to as "evangelicals" since the very early days of the Reformation because of our emphasis on the gospel message that we are freed *from* sin and death by Jesus Christ *for* participating



with God in the healing of the whole creation. Rather than jettison this word that once identified our core identity so well, we can reclaim it by living boldly as gospel people. We can help one another and the wider community see and celebrate the good news that the Jesus-announced coming of the kingdom of God *is* at hand right now. We can demonstrate how gospel people—"evangelicals"—practice radical hospitality, passionate worship, lifelong faith formation, extravagant generosity, and bold service.

We are part of the *Evangelical* Lutheran Church in America because we have good news about Jesus to experience and share.

Faith 5

Thank you to all the families that have joined us for Faith 5 in September. We look forward to a great year ahead strengthening our faith together as we talk, read, pray together, and bless one another in the name of the Lord.

Imagine your child when she or he is starting the 9th grade. What will your conversations at home look like? Our hope is that a radical change will come about through Faith 5 where our young children will grow up having a deeper conversation with their parents about important matters.



This same hope is that despite the daily schedule that you and your future teenager have, you take time to do the following:

- •Share Highs and Lows about the best and worst part of the day/week.
- •Read Bible passages from worship and talk about what the reading means to you and your child.
- Pray with each other and for each other.
- •Bless your child by marking the sign of the cross on their forehead before bed.

One honest truth is that sometimes parents don't always know what to say to their teen. Using the Faith 5 now when they are in preschool or elementary school is a great way to integrate this practice into your home life daily.



On October 31,1517, Martin Luther nailed his beliefs to the front door of the church in Wittenberg, Germany.

One way to celebrate your beliefs are to post your beliefs too.

So, I have three questions for your family:

- 1. Do you own a front door?
- 2. Do you have some paper and a marker?
- 3. Do you have beliefs about being a Lutheran Christians?

If you answered yes to these things (which I'm sure you did!), try creating your own 95 Theses* on your front door. One fun way to involve the whole family is by asking, "What do we believe about God? Jesus? The Holy Spirit? Spirit of Joy? God's Creation?" From there, have yourself, your spouse, your kids or anybody else at your house write down what you truly believe in your heart to be true. When you're done, tape your beliefs to the front door! ... Or you could nail it like Martin did, but tape works too!



Through feedback from our recent Visioning Process, we are discerning the Holy Spirit's call into deeper relationships in our community. We are primarily pursuing—and continuing—community relationships in these three areas:

In hopes of supporting particular students and educators in our community, we are considering congregational sponsorship of Bridges at Horace Mann Elementary School. We would love to say "yes" to this relationship, but it will require many of our partners—like you—to say "yes" to getting involved!



As sponsors, our highest priorities would be providing weekly one-on-one mentors for students (facilitated through Lutheran Social Services) and offering ongoing support to the teachers and staff. Staff support would include serving dinner during parent-teacher conferences and sending supportive notes and modest gifts at Christmas time and at other times throughout the year.
