Romans 3:28 "For we maintain that a person is justified by faith apart from the works of the law."

Paul's letter to the congregation in Rome was his masterpiece. Paul and the people of Rome knew of each other, but Paul had not yet visited and he was not yet familiar with all of the inner workings of the congregation, so the letter was less of a pastoral response to a specific situation and more of an introduction to himself, his way of thinking about the Christian faith, and an invitation building up of the kingdom. Carefully considered and thoughtfully arranged, it was built on the foundations of scripture and has laid the groundwork for much of the theological work done since its publication.

Our foundation for mission and ministry at Spirit of Joy are those same Hebrew scriptures that Paul leaned on, and the expanded Christian scriptures, of which Paul was a primary author. To understand those writings, we look through the lens of church teachers, including Martin Luther, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, St. Augustine, and the contemporary teachings of our ELCA and its leaders. From that study and attention, we have arrived at five key perspectives and five corresponding priorities/commitments/values that have been the groundwork from which we have built the community that is Spirit of Joy.

Our Key Perspectives and Core Practices

1. Jesus Christ is the way to life. Passionate Worship

We believe Jesus is Lord (John 20:28), and that He has most clearly revealed who He is by His suffering love on a cross. Following Jesus is our first priority, and the way to experience life that is abundant (John 10:10), joy-filled (John 15:11), and everlasting (John 3:16).

2. All people matter to God and so they matter to us. Radical Hospitality

We are committed to obeying Jesus' New Commandment (John 13:34-35) and to reaching out with the unconditional and everlasting love of Jesus to all people, just as they are, without regard to race, beliefs, gender, age, sexual orientation, lifestyle, or anything else.

- 3. Following Jesus is a life-long, growing experience. Lifelong Faith Formation
- When we meet God through the love of Christ, we are changed and impelled towards spiritual maturity (Philippians 3:13 -14). For this reason we strive to bring people into an ever-growing relationship with Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:19).
- 4. Every Jesus follower is called to and gifted for ministry. Extravagant Generosity We believe God calls every believer to ministry, and gives every believer special gifts and abilities for faithful living and serving (1 Corinthians 12).
- 5. God is continually at work in us to transform the world. **Bold Service**We believe God is at work here and now, through the Holy Spirit, to empower and equip us for carrying out our mission (John 14:26, Acts 2:1-42).

My invitation to you is to the daily living out of these perspectives and values as a true partner with Spirit of Joy. Our future together, will be built on these same foundations and I hope that individually you will hear God's call to live these values. Just as Paul wrote to the congregation in Rome uncertain what would come of their partnership, I can not tell you what our future together might bring. But, it will be rooted in scripture, and built on the foundation you and all the saints who have gone before us have lain. And, in that, I trust that the Holy Spirit will bless us with faith, hope, and love.

What We're Doing Around Spirit of Joy

Have you noticed the new blue "saddle baskets" in the classrooms, and paired trash/ recycling bins and signage? We are passionate about keeping recyclable items out of the landfill. Creation Care team members toured Millennium Recycling and it was an excellent learning experience. If you have recycling questions, check out Millennium's Website or Facebook page. They are passionate about debunking recycling myths and banishing "wish-cycling!"





Have you noticed the brown strip of land on the east side of our property? This 0.1 ac. strip will be seeded to native grasses and wildflowers this fall in a dormant seeding. Some seeds need the overwintering process to improve the germination rate. Next spring seedlings such as little bluestem, switchgrass, milkweed, coneflower, and purple prairie clover will emerge. Insects need certain plants to complete their lifecycle; for example, Monarch butterflies need milkweeds for their caterpillars to eat. Flowers provide nectar and pollen as energy sources for butterflies and bees. Just like humans need a healthy diet, God's little creatures need good nutrition too. Our little prairie area will help provide that.

Other Creation Care Happenings

- Decreased paper usage for bulletins
- Increased use of technology such as digital directory to save paper
- Purchased cart for collecting trash and recycling efficiently
- Swapped out recycle bins from hauler for bigger 95-gal bins to handle larger capacity
- Working with Southeast Technical Institute welding department to make bike rack

What You Can Do At Home

Have you heard the phrase "leave the leaves?" Many of us rake, mow, and blow away every leaf in our yard -but fallen leaves provide valuable habitats for overwintering pollinators. A layer of leaves can help protect overwintering animals. If you can, leave a few out-of-the-way leaf piles, perhaps in the corner of your yard or under shrubs and trees. Also, consider leaving most perennials uncut through the winter. Some native bee species nest in hollow stems and many butterflies and moths pupate and spend the winter on these plants. Birds such as goldfinches eat the seeds of black-eyed susans and coneflowers. There's no real need to cut back perennials until early spring, when new growth begins to push through.
