A New Season Unlike Any Other

This is my favorite tree in Sioux Falls. It's in the parking lot of St. Mary's School, which is just a few blocks from our house. (For the record, my favorite *row of trees* in Sioux Falls is on the south edge of Spirit of Joy's community gardens.)

In late July the tree's leaves begin evolving in color. Every week the colors change, postcard-like in their updates to walkersby like me, until finally the leaves start to fall.

We're now in our third fall in our house, and thereby our third fall with this tree. Until now I felt grateful for the tree's welcome of the fall season, which is increasingly (well, usually) my favorite season. This time around, however, the falling leaves carry a twinge of foreboding for me.

It's going to be a long winter. Of that we can be sure. Over the past few months, bursts of good weather have given blissful breaks from the ongoing isolation of the pandemic: opportunities to gather outside with loved ones, frequent walks and friendly neighbor greetings, time to travel and experience some much-needed changes of scenery. But those warm days are ending. Now it will be more difficult to gather safely outside. Days are becoming dramatically shorter. Darkness seems to be descending, literally and perhaps metaphorically too.

The joyful occasions of fall and winter carry so much uncertainty that they, for me, do not yet balance out the darkness: who knows what Halloween, Thanksgiving, and even Christmas will look like this year?

My favorite tree will soon be barren for the winter. And yet even during the winter, while the tree rests, it will still be growing, even if silently. And next spring, its leaves will sprout again. In the same way, we trust that life and growth and faith will continue and will sustain us during this change of season. Even if we are forced to settle into a new phase of separation from loved ones, we will not be alone. God will make sure of it, as God always does. And we'll try our best to make sure of that, too, as the community of Spirit of Joy.

As this season changes, may God's peace and comfort be yours. May God remind you that you are never alone. If you need a reminder of that, please don't hesitate to contact me or any of us on staff. We'll tell you again and again.

October Worship Schedule



At the recommendation of Spirit of Joy's Reopening Task Force, our congregation will postpone our first indoor worship service that was planned for Sunday, October 4. The task force, made up of several our partners who are doctors along with staff members and unpaid servant leaders, agreed that due to the dramatic increase in COVID cases and hospitalizations in our area in the past week, we should pause the opportunity to gather indoors for morning prayer for a few more weeks. Stay tuned for further updates.

Spirit of Joy will again offer a variety of opportunities to worship with us:

- You may worship online via our YouTube channel. Watch your email tomorrow for a link to that service or visit our YouTube page.
- We will host a Service of Holy Communion on our newly renovated parking lot at 10:30 a.m. (Note new time). Worshipers may choose to stay in their cars where they can listen via FM radio transmission, or sit outside your vehicles in your own lawn chairs. There will be an area near the front of the lot for physically distanced outside seating. Masks are encouraged. Those who desire to receive Holy Communion will receive bread and wine in a non -contact manner. The church building will not be open.
- Children of Joy will remain virtual until further notice.

We will continue to carefully assess the spread of COVID in our community, and continue to work towards a safe reopening of our building for worship later in October. Please watch your emails, our Facebook page and website for further updates.

Spirit of Joy Leadership Team Meeting Minutes September 17, 2020 @ 6:30 p.m. via Zoom

I. Unfinished Business

- A. **Building Expansion:** See proposal documents for more information.
 - 1. Pay Application #6 September 2020: Lori Tripp moved, Michelle Stanek seconded to approve the payment of \$315,087.54 as noted on the Application and Certificate for Payment from Journey Group Companies (Invoice #201101-06). Motion carried.
 - 2. **Landscaping Proposal:** Brad Tams moved, Jodi Hanson seconded to approve the payment of \$7811.83 for landscaping around the new sign. Motion carried.
 - 3. **Audio Visual Integrations Payment:** Lori Tripp moved, Sarah Manthey seconded to approve the payment of \$130,000 for the audiovisual system. Motion carried.
 - 4. **JLG Amended Services Agreement and Cost:** Ron Risty moved, Brad Tams seconded to approve the payment of \$5000 for changes to the original parking lot proposal. Motion carried.
 - 5. **Furnishings Proposal:** Jodi Hanson moved, Sarah Manthey seconded to approve a payment of approximately \$100,000 (within the budget) for new furnishings. Additional funding will be approved at a later date for kitchen items. Motion carried.
 - 6. **Global Plasma Solutions ionization System:** Ron Risty moved, Brad Tams seconded to approve the payment of \$29,042.95 for an ionization system to remove bacteria and viruses from the building (unsure of effectiveness of removing coronavirus). Motion carried.
- B. **Mission Investment Fund Loan Update**: The process for making payments has been improved and is working smoothly now.
- C. Reopening Church Building Update: See III G written report.

II. New Business

- A. **Mission Partner Covenant Agreement with Church on the Street (COS):** Jodi Hanson moved, Lori Tripp seconded to affirm the covenant agreement with the COS. COS will work with our youth and SoJ will provide monetary support. Motion carried.
- B. **2021 Mission Plan Preparation:** Committees will begin working on budgets in October. The Leadership Team will meet on November 5, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. to review the plan. The Congregational meeting is tentatively planned for Sunday, November 22, 2020.
- C. Property Improvement Fund for Neighbors in Need: Pastor Jeff was approached regarding SoJ providing financial assistance for home repairs for a local family. Discussion followed. Pastor Christy will meet with Carole Chell and the Outreach Committee to explore this opportunity and discuss the potential criteria and implementation process.
- D. **September Benevolence:** Sarah Manthey moved, Michelle Stanek seconded to approve the following benevolence payments. Motion carried.



Entry Into Confirmation Milestone




Spirit of Joy Preschool

In the midst of COVID uncertainties, the preschool year has started off rather smoothly. Although some families have chosen to wait for preschool, understandably, there are 14 students attending that are ready to learn and have fun with friends. We are so very glad they are here!

The year started off enjoying friends and learning about fall. A special thank you to the Spirit of Joy gardeners for sharing their talents. We have discovered many unique flowers, leaves, and fall produce as a part of the learning activities and fall walks. Our Bible stories have included "God Creates" and "Adam and Eve". We have been able to learn and retell the Bible stories using rice sensory bottles, Legos, Oreos, and pipe cleaner snakes (among other items) -- memorable ways to experience the story along with reading it from the Bible.

Changes to the program this year include an extended learning day to offer even more learning opportunities for preschoolers. Previously, we found ourselves running out of time during the shorter day. Additionally, we have the addition of lunch eaten at preschool as potential preschool families have asked for extended hours to accommodate work schedules. Students and staff have not had a hard time finding ways to fill our time!
