Last month in Windswept I shared some of the places Katherine and I visited this past summer as I enjoyed your gift of a sabbatical. We traveled to several national parks in the Mountain West and went boating on northern Minnesota lakes. We

hiked and paddled in some beautiful places.

On the road and at home throughout the summer we also regularly encountered the smoky haze that was the result of thousands of wildfires. Smoke was the backdrop of nearly every landscape. We repeatedly saw the impact of the extreme drought that afflicted most of the territory we visited. During those same summer days other regions of the country experienced tremendous rainfall and killing floods.


No single summer filled with such devastating events could provide enough data for scientists to determine that the Earth's climate is changing. However, the vast majority of climate scientists around the world agree that events like these on top of decades of research do tell us that our planet is warming, human beings are responsible, and the impact is widespread and serious.

This month we move into the time of year when our congregation joins many congregations in considering how to live as faithful stewards of the good gifts God has given us. That usually means an examination of what we do with our time, our talents and our treasure. We will invite your

reflection on these things again this year. We will also invite you who to gather in a new small group and talk about how we can more faithfully respond to God's first call to us in Genesis. We will look specifically at our Christian responsibility in the midst of climate change.

Our guide for this discussion will be Christian climate scientist and author Katharine Hayhoe. Hayhoe repeatedly encourages faith communities to begin responding to the climate crisis by talking about the issue. It has for too long been one more issue that divides us into separate hostile camps resulting in fear, hopelessness, and silence. And silence means the status quo will prevail as the planet continues to heat up with devastating consequences.

Spirit of Joy's conversation will begin on Tuesday, November 2nd at 6:30 p.m. in our building (room to be determined). A good way to get ready for the conversation is to purchase Dr. Hayhoe's brand new book, *Saving Us: A Climate Scientist' Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World.* Or check out her TED Talk, "The Most Important Thing You Can Do to Fight Climate Change: Talk about It." Climate change, like so many huge problems facing us today, can seem insurmountable. God's first call to us comes with a power greater than our own so we can serve as people of healing and hope. The Robcast focuses primarily on human development, maturation, and education. These episodes start very simply, evolving to explain a complex growth and development model called Spiral Dynamics (for a little background on Spiral Dynamics visit this link: https://jthowlett.medium.com/using-spiral-dynamics-to-understand-development-930098e8f092). Rob's message is ultimately about love and meeting people wherever they are.

The goals of Spiral Dynamics include knowing ourselves and giving space for others to be themselves. Ideally we find ourselves in a stage of development and learn to accept others where they are. Everyone begins at the egocentric stage. As we grow, we move towards the ethnocentric or sociocentric stage, (from ME to WE). Finally, some of us are able to move to the integral stage that and include others (from WE to EVERYBODY).

Reclaiming Rest: Sabbath Study and Practices

Stillness. Prayer. Sabbath. In a restless world, what do those words even mean?

Public health expert Kate H. Rademacher grew up thinking it was up to humans to bring healing and justice to

earth. Saving the world meant working long hours, answering emails day or night, and competing for professional awards and funding. In an era of pandemic, racial injustice, and deepening inequality, who's got time for a nap?


Stressed out and frazzled, Rademacher landed on the Christian story, in which a sought-after Savior retreats to solitary places and prays alone in the wilderness. In the pages of Reclaiming Rest, Rademacher tells the story of a year of monthly Sabbath retreats, during which she withdraws from family and work obligations for periods of solitude. She also experiments with disciplines like walking, praying, taking a break from social media, and finding a Sabbath buddy. In lyrical and astute prose, Rademacher teases out answers to questions like: What does rest in a restless world look like? How is Sabbath connected to issues of justice? Vocation? Parenting? Simplicity?

Ultimately, Rademacher claims, Sabbath pierces our illusions of self-reliance and control, and that's good news. What if keeping the Sabbath is not only a commandment to obey but a freedom to reclaim?

Join us for a four week exploration of sabbath. Our study will rely on the book "Reclaiming Rest: The Promise of Sabbath, Solitude, and Stillness in a Restless World" by Kate H. Rademacher.

Join us Sundays at 6:30 p.m. for a 90-minute event. After 30 minutes for opening devotions and book discussion we will share in an introduction to a different sabbath practice. It's not too late! Preschool began on September 8th and we have been off and running ever since! Twenty-one children call Spirit of Joy their preschool with more than half of them new friends and neighbors. This groups is our largest class to date. Miss Kendra and I are so excited to have the preschool children back. The routines are established. Spirit of Joy is becoming a comforting place away from home.

Children have begun to learn classmates' names as well as how important each person is to God and to us. Daily prayers of thanksgiving are said for preschool friends both here and at home. At the beginning of the year, we have talked about how to be a friend and share God's love with others. Children are forming new friendships by helping one another as well as showing kindness and respect. We talked about how everyone can share kindness with others through smiles, pictures, helping hands, and hugs. As a part of our curriculum, each month preschool staff and children participate in a "Love Your Neighbor" project. In September, preschool children created and hand delivered fall leaves to share with church staff, family members, and visitors.

The preschoolers love to learn and try new activities such as buttoning and zipping, writing our names, balancing on a circle, yoga, silly faces, and making paper trees with beads. 




From the Bishop's Desk

Spirit of Joy Leadership Team Meeting Minutes September 16, 2021 @ 6:30 p.m.

I. Unfinished Business

A. Updated COVID Protocol: no change

- B. Mission Investment Fund Building Loan Paydown and Mortgage Options.
 - 1. Conversation regarding those scenarios led to a question about a potential penalty with Mission Investment Fund that stalled a decision about repayment schedules and whether or not to refinance.
 - 2. The amount from savings to apply towards principal. Pr. Jeff led this conversation and suggested an amount that leaves enough cushion for repairs and rainy days in the ballpark of 9-12 months worth of payments. Moved by Andrew Hewitt. Second by Lori Tripp. To apply \$650,000 toward the repayment of the construction loan from savings.
- C. **Conference Room Technology:** Three bids from two contractors were received. Midstates Audio and AVI submitted bids ranging from \$4400 to \$83200. The decision was made to proceed with AVI due to their familiarity with the building and our other equipment. Moved by Chad Wolff. Second by Kendra Krueger. To enter into a contract with AVI for the installation of technology in the Conference Room not to exceed \$6000.

II. New Business

- A. Letter from Deacon Susan Wold Rohde, Music Leader and Director of Choirs. The letter was received with deep appreciation for Deacon Wold Rohde and her many years of excellent and faithful service.
- B. **Director of Faith Formation Job Description and Call Process.** Pastor Jeff worked with Growth Team and Faith Formation staff to come up with a new job description. Their desire was to see the position grow to full time with a new emphasis on staff supervision, programmatic continuity, and more robust "small group" ministries. Moved by Sarah Manthey. Second by Chad Wolff. To call a meeting of the congregation at 10AM on Sunday, October 10 to consider moving to a full-time call for the Director of Lifelong Faith Formation and forming a Call Committee.
- C. Annual November Congregational Meeting Day and Time. Moved by Lori Tripp. Second by Kendra Krueger. That the Annual November Congregation Meeting to consider the 21022 Mission Plan be November 21 at 10AM.
- D. **September Benevolence:** Church on the Street \$1000; Ministries—Food to You \$1000; ELCA World Hunger \$1000; Pueblo \$1000; ; Lutheran Outdoors \$2100 for "Keep the Campfires Burning" Campaign. (\$600 from Camp Scholarships, \$1500 from VBS Fund)
- III. Meeting Review and Lord's Prayer: The meeting was adjourned following the Lord's Prayer.
