You will say in that day: I will give thanks to you, O LORD, for though you were angry with me, your anger turned away, and you comforted me. Surely God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid, for the LORD GOD is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation. With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. And you will say in that day: Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name.... Isaiah 12:1-4

I am currently using a devotional from Bible Gateway called "A 40 Day Journey with Dietrich Bonhoeffer". When I'm struggling spiritually, I find myself coming back to his writings and using them in devotions. His discipline mingled with a realistic and pain informed worldview are what I need in those moments. A few days ago, he began with the scripture above. Then, he followed with this brief commentary:

"Thankfulness works in the Christian community as it usually does in the Christian life. Only those who give thanks for the little things receive the great things as well. We prevent God from giving us the great spiritual gifts prepared for us because we do not give thanks for daily gifts. We think that we should not be satisfied with the small measure of spiritual knowledge, experience, and love that has been given to us, and that we must constantly be seeking the great gifts. Then we complain that we lack the deep certainty, the strong faith, and the rich experiences that God has given to other Christians, and we consider these complaints to be pious. We pray for the big things and forget to give thanks for the small (and yet really not so small!) gifts we receive daily. How can God entrust great things to those who will not gratefully receive the little things from God's hand?"

I am guilty of missing the small things when I'm in a season of dryness, like this. I forget to give thanks for you, for your generosity, for your constant commitment to our mission and ministry. I miss that the pictures of children and grandchildren returning to school are part of our living out our baptismal call to community and I ought join you in rejoicing. I miss out on celebrating the amazing things that you do for one another and to make the world a better place every day because I am lost in the brokenness and pain, looking for instant transformation, rather than appreciate your constant and persistent goodness.

And so, in this newsletter, I hope that you'll see the small gifts that we share together. While the bank balance isn't great, your generosity is. Thank you. Our enrollment in faith formation is strong and we can't wait for the blessing of Kickoff Sunday. Thank you for taking the time to update information and for planning to show up! We're about to welcome another round of new partners and continue our growth. Thank you for practicing hospitality! We are in a season of milestones and will keep those aforementioned promises to 9th graders, 6th graders, and 3 year olds all just this month. Our worship continues with the choir coming back and a new liturgy that we'll learn together. Thank you for bringing your passion to worship. We'll bless the Liberia Mission and return to our series on social justice. Thank you for being so bold in your service.

I lose track of all the blessings around me, but you don't. Thank you!

A prayer for your month from Bonhoeffer: "Lord, open my eyes that I may see the giftedness of my life and let my life be a hymn of praise and thanksgiving. Amen."




## Choir Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 5:30 PM



Have you heard of the Canadian company, Plaex, who has been repurposing plastic waste to make building bricks for homes, kind of like Legos? They are 3x sturdier than regular bricks.

Do you know who Monika Seyfried is? She's the youth innovator behind Grow Your Own Cloud, which is a new biotech company storing data in the DNA of plants.

Did you know they have solar paint (aka photovoltaic paint)? While it isn't efficient enough now to be functional or cost-effective, this technology is getting closer and closer to reaching that point.

Are you aware that scientists have discovered that playing the sounds of a thriving coral reef via underwater speakers is helping to attract coral larvae and fish back to the dying reefs? This is a study in progress yet still an exciting one.

Let us continue to be filled with amazement and wonder at all the gifts the Almighty has provided. God, we thank you for teachers, for scientists, for those who keep asking questions and finding solutions, and for people who want to preserve your wonderful planet for generations to come.

Who? You! All are welcome.


When? Monday, September 23, 6:30-7:30pm


