

Faith: the gap between readiness and reality

"The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" - Psalm 27:1

"So are you ready?"

It's a question Jon and I are asked often these days, while the birth of our first child is imminent.

The answer is no.

We're reading books, collecting nursery items, and getting paperwork in order. But we'll never be fully ready. I'll never be fully prepared for the moment of childbirth (or, perhaps more accurately, the many moments of childbirth). We'll never be ready for the ways our lives will change after our child's birth.



These days I've often thought about a poignantly similar conversation I once had.

I was sitting with someone whose spouse was dying. Knowing their beloved's death was imminent, the spouse said, "I will never be ready." They would never be ready for the moment of death, nor would they be ready for the ways life would change after that moment.

And so it is with major changes in life, whether the changes are welcomed or not, whether the changes bring sadness or joy: birth, death, new homes, new jobs, new relationships. None of us can ever be fully prepared.

And yet, it's into those spaces—those gaps between readiness and reality—where faith comes in. And at such times, faith can take different shapes and sounds. Faith may sound like claiming the words of Psalm 27:1—"The Lord is my light and my salvation. Whom shall I fear?" Faith may taste like bread and wine. Faith may sound like the chime of a text from a caring friend. Faith may look like children and adults praying together for the people and animals of Australia.

In faith communities like ours, one of the greatest gifts we can offer is to step into those gaps for one another and for the world: to offer the words and presence of God, who meets us in the uncertain spaces between readiness and reality.

As Jon and I march through these final weeks of preparation for our child's birth, I am so grateful for the ways you are surrounding us with care and encouragement. Thank you for the words and gifts and prayers for our child and for us. You are helping to fill our gap between readiness and reality.

May God meet you in the space where you currently reside: whether chugging along in your routine, or facing an uncertain future in any way. May the Holy Spirit give you faith to fill the gap.

BeFriender Ministry

On Sunday, December 8, four partners of Spirit of Joy were commissioned as BeFrienders. The new BeFrienders, Shirley Bauer, Deb Nelson, Lynn Risty, and Lori VanBalleyoogen join those who were commissioned last year: Sandy Ellingsen, Marilyn Gannon and Elaine Frary. These BeFrienders completed the training on how to be a listener. They know that, "Sometimes you just need to talk about something, not to get sympathy or help, but just to kill its power by allowing the truth of things to hit the air."

There are many times in our lives when we need someone to just to hear a concern and the pain we are feeling. It's those feelings that wake us up at 3:00am and stay with us. You can call a BeFriender to talk this out; to say it aloud. BeFrienders are trained to listen. You will be able to talk it out; look at it, and let the power of that concern lessen.

We all deal with losses in our lives. Moving from your home, death of a loved one or divorce, retiring, loss of a job, dealing with an illness, caregiving and more. Every one experiences these losses differently. Often when we are permitted to share the pain, the loneliness, the load we carry; then that pain, that loneliness, that load becomes lighter. A BeFriender visit is a confidential visit.

BeFrienders are ready to listen, to allow you to tell your story and help you lighten your load. Ask for a BeFriender to meet with you and share a cup of coffee.

January 2020: Journey Construction competitively bids project and hires subcontractors

February 4, 2020: SoJ Building Team meets to receive report of bidding outcomes and consider possible alternates if funding is available

February 20, 2020: SoJ Leadership Team meets to consider any final adjustments to building plan and consider possible finance package

March 2020: Congregation votes on financing with ELCA Mission Investment Fund

Late March 2020: Groundbreaking!

Early April: Temporary fencing and partitions installed


April 13 (Monday after Easter Sunday): Construction begins!

May-December: Construction of new building and remodeling of current building. (This will necessitate the use of the west entrance to our building for much of the spring and summer as our expansion plan includes creation of a new main entrance to the building. Gathering space, sanctuary, kitchen and classrooms will continue to be usable.)

Mid-December 2020: Move in to the new building!*

Christmas Eve 2020: Worship in our new worship space!

*As is the case with any new construction, the timeline will depend somewhat on weather conditions throughout the spring and summer. A really wet spring or summer may mean delays for completion of construction.
