She was a gifted special education teacher, trained and experienced in the art of being calm, persuasive, and handling challenges. Through her example and her persuasiveness, I learned the importance of salad, and I try to eat plenty of vegetables. She helped me to adjust my pallet. Today, I am grateful...even if as a kid I was bitter about eating those junky vegetables.

Often our pallets need to be adjusted, for our own good and for the good of our neighbor. Often we limit ourselves to what we're used to, and this can be to our disadvantage and even more so to the disadvantage of others around us.



The Holy Spirit disrupts our lives, not in a way to break us, but instead to expand our pallets to the wonderful, healthy, beautiful things around us, and to use us as instruments of the same, good things.

This pandemic messed up our lives in many ways, especially for those who have lost jobs or had loved ones suffer or die. Our world is not the same as it was 3 months ago, and it will never fully be the same.

At the risk of minimizing the hardships of the pandemic, it has also given us pause to reflect on what is important. And, maybe it has given us enough pause to acquire some new tastes; things that are meaningful and good for ourselves and for others. Because we have become accustomed to things that may not be good or helpful. Things like: over-scheduled calendars, spending money on things we don't really need instead of giving more away to ministries and charities, forgetting about our neighbor who lives alone. We have even become accustomed to genuine brokenness, like racism (I write this in the wake of yet another wrongful death of an African American person, George Floyd).

Our pallets need adjustment, and to realize the gifts of the Holy Spirit. She is disrupting our lives in good, meaningful ways; and she is persistent and persuasive. She directs us forward to love others, expanding our hearts and minds in many, mysterious ways.

I forgot to tell you that my mom was stubborn, too. She didn't give up easily. And, she was faithful in prayer, striving to be open to the Spirit's work in her life. And, the Spirit used her to shape me in many ways (much more than just my salad consumption). She taught me to remember and care for the vulnerable, to be an instrument of God's love.

I'm personally still a work in progress, and always will be. But, I enjoy salads much more than I used to, and I better understand their importance for my health and how I live in the world.

May this season after Pentecost, even in the midst of a global pandemic, be a time for us to realize the Holy Spirit's work in our lives and world. The Spirit is alive, disrupting our lives in meaningful ways, persuasively refining our pallets for the sake of ourselves and for the sake of our neighbors.

The Ascension of Our Lord, May 21, 2020 @ 6:30 p.m.

#### I. Unfinished Business

- A. Building Expansion
  - 1. Pay Application #2 May 2020: Darlene Weber-Scott presented the Application and Certificate for Payment from Journey Group Companies (Invoice #201101-020). Brad Tams moved and Lori Tripp seconded to approve the payment of \$375,465.81. Motion carried.
  - 2. Church Sign Location: Brad Tams will attend the construction meeting to discuss any barriers to sign placement.
  - 3. Parking Lot: Darlene Weber-Scott presented information on three options to fix the existing parking lot and to add additional parking spaces. Discussion followed. The Leadership Team would like additional options for parking to improve traffic flow and so garden spaces are not lost. Will request additional options before going forward.
- B. Mission Investment Fund Loan Update: Amy Orr has initiated paperwork to have the liability insurance rewritten. Darlene Weber-Scott and Michelle Stanek will be signing the promissory note in the near future.

#### II. New Business

- A. Summer Building Use Requests
  - 1. Community summer school: Discussed request for use of the building in June and July for a summer reading camp. Due to the current renovation of the existing building, as well as concerns about procedures related to COVID-19 (sanitizing, etc.), the Leadership Team recommended denying the request for this summer, but welcome community requests in the future.
  - 2. Family Events/Gatherings: Requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and will follow recommended COVID-19 procedures in place at that time.
- B. Summer Worship Guidelines and Options: Prior to the meeting, Pastor Jeff e-mailed links to several documents that discussed guidelines for returning to onsite worship. Until it is safe to do that, other more interactive ideas, while still physically distancing, were discussed including having a parade on Pentecost Sunday and parking lot worship services. The Pastors and several members of the leadership team will contact others in the area to learn more about the details in providing this type of worship. Having the parking lot under construction may alter the timeline. The Leadership Team will begin planning for Fall 2020 in June.




### Spirit of Joy's High School Graduation Milestone
