Here in Spirit of Joy, we have talked often the past several years about God's calling. I hope you have heard how God has called you to live as a Jesus follower in all your particular circumstances: in your family, among your friends, in your daily work, through your church, in your school, neighborhood and city. As Kathleen Cahalan writes in her book The Stories We Live, "We find our callings within the stories of our lives—the story of God at work all around us."

This month during the season of Lent we're going to tell stories about some of the ways God shows up at meaningful moments in our lives.



We're calling this Lent series "Callings at the Crossroads." On each Wednesday night in Lent, starting March 4th, we'll be listening to a story from Scripture and stories from partners that will help us see and hear God's calling at challenging times in our lives.

The Crossroads we will travel on the way to the Cross of Good Friday are Reimagining Family, Caught in the Unexpected, Growing Older, Bridging our Divides, and Facing Dead Ends. On each Wednesday evening we hear these stories we will also consider a simple prayer practice to assist our hearing and answering God's call at the crossroads.

Once we set aside our assumptions that God calls only certain super devout disciples, we can begin to hear God calling us, sometimes in a whisper, sometimes with a holler, always to living a life that is not easy but is always permeated with joy and grace.

The Power of Naming – A BeFriender Story

"'Why are you so sad?', my husband asked. I knew I was melancholy, but I really hadn't named what I was feeling. But naming the emotion was only the beginning. Why was I sad? I began thinking through my life and realized there were several things I regretted that I had never named. But even knowing what the regrets were did not lighten my sadness. I decided I needed to meet with a BeFriender. I knew that what I would tell her would be confidential and I felt safe to name the things that I regretted and feared. As I named them, I realized that some of them had never been named aloud before. I still have moments of sadness, but I feel much lighter. And since I have named them, I find it is becoming easier to let go of the regrets and move on; to forgive myself. All this by naming – first the emotion and then the reasons for that emotion. My BeFriender and I only met once, but I know I can call her for a second meeting." - Anonymous
